



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 81-2006

To authorize the execution of two Service Agreements with veterinarians and clinics belonging to the Brampton Veterinary Association

WHEREAS The Corporation of the City of Brampton wishes to enter into an arrangement with veterinarians and clinics that are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association such that these veterinarians can provide support to Brampton Animal Services;

AND WHEREAS entering into the appropriate agreements with the veterinarians will facilitate the provision of services to ensure the safety and comfort of stray animals, and the provision of rabies vaccines for pets of people who may not otherwise be in a position to afford them.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton enacts as follows:

1. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute two (2) agreements for the provision of veterinary services by several veterinarians and clinics in Brampton (which belong to the Brampton Veterinary Association) to Brampton Animal Services:
 - a) one agreement for the provision of services to Brampton Animal Services for the medical care, safety and comfort of stray animals at a discounted rate;
 - b) the second agreement for the provision of rabies vaccinations, at a discounted rate, for animals owned by people who receive government subsidies.

The parties to the agreement shall be as follows, but may be subject to change, with the authorization of the City solicitor and Commissioner of Community Services.





PROVISION OF SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Provision of Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is effective as of January 1, 2006, and is between

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON
(hereinafter the "City")

and

Dervetco Holding Ltd.
(hereinafter the "Participant")

WHEREAS Brampton Animal Services ("BAS") and the Participant and various other veterinary clinics in the City of Brampton (the "Other Participants") have established relationships to ensure the medical care, safety and comfort of stray animals in Brampton in accordance with the City's by-laws and provincial legislation;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and Other Participants are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and the City wish to enter into this agreement to formalize their relationship, and acknowledge that any previous agreements or arrangements regarding the content of this agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

General Administration

1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours. *← Washburn*
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays. *9 AM*
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal. *1 PM*

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. The 20% discount for the City will remain in place despite any changes to the Fees. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City of Brampton with any adjustments to the Fee schedule.
16. Any citizen who comes to the Participant during BAS hours with a Stray Animal not needing medical attention should be referred to BAS, and BAS will pick up the animal during BAS's regular hours.
17. Any citizen who comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal not in need of medical attention after BAS hours of operation, will be advised to make every attempt to assure the animal is comfortable and safe. BAS will pick up the animal during its regular hours of operation.
18. If the Stray Animal requires only minor treatments (ie. treatment for ear mites) that can be handled by BAS, the Participant will permit the Stray Animal to be treated by BAS.
19. The City will not be responsible for any fees, including, but not limited to overnight hospitalization, and boarding, on healthy Stray Animals that are examined or admitted during regular BAS hours.
20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where
 - The animal is still under the care of the Participant
 - The animal was under veterinary care and has since deceased
 - The animal has been returned to BAS
22. The Participant must provide BAS, as soon as possible with as much detail as possible, including the citizen's name, address, telephone numbers, the animal's description and health status, and the time, date and location the Stray Animal was found.
23. The Participant shall make an attempt to collect Fees from the owner if the owner attends the Participant's clinic. The owner will not receive a 20% discount on the Fees.
24. At the time the Stray Animal is discharged to BAS, an itemized invoice should accompany the animal. A brief medical report should also accompany the animal, which includes pertinent medical findings, ongoing treatment, and recommendations.

25. BAS will provide:

- a. The removal of all Stray Animals after the redemption period (3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays).
- b. Payment (net 45 days) upon receiving invoice with no late payment or interest charges being applied to the invoice.

Wild Animals

26. BAS will not take responsibility for wild animals. The Participant can treat or euthanise the wild animal at the Participant's discretion, at the Participant's expense. If the Participant contacts BAS, an officer will pick up the wild animal.

Adopted Animals

27. For all animals adopted from BAS, the first visit to a Participant for a check-up will be free of charge if it is held within 96 hours of the adoption of the animal.
28. As part of this check-up, the Participant will establish the early health status of the animal and provide a sound health program (including a vaccination schedule) to be outlined for the new pet owner.
29. BAS will not steer owners of newly adopted animals to a particular veterinary clinic, the Participant or Other Participants. People who have adopted animals from BAS are not required to use a veterinarian, the Participant or Other Participants in Brampton for the free exam.

Indemnity and Insurance

30. The Participant shall indemnify, save harmless and release the City, and all those for whom it is in law responsible, from any and all claims, causes of action, suits, proceedings, or obligations, for any losses, damages, including bodily injury (and including death) or costs, and reasonable legal fees, both direct or indirect, howsoever and whatsoever incurred, suffered or sustained in connection with the Participant's operations under this Agreement, unless caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the City.
31. The City shall indemnify, save harmless and release the Participant, and all those for whom it is in law responsible, from any and all claims, causes of action, suits, proceedings, or obligations, for any losses, damages, including bodily injury (and including death) or costs, and reasonable legal fees, both direct or indirect, howsoever and whatsoever incurred, suffered or sustained in connection with the City's operations under this Agreement, unless caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the Participant.
32. It is understood by the Participant and the City that each party to this Agreement has in place sufficient insurance to protect the parties in relation to their operations and indemnification of other parties under this Agreement.

Term

- 33. This Agreement shall be in effect for a period of one year from the 1st of January, 200~~8~~ (the "Term") unless terminated by the City pursuant to clause 34. *C. Winberg*

- 34. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by the City upon 30 days written notice to the Participant, and the Participant may terminate this Agreement upon 30 days written notice to the City.
- 35. Provided there has been no prior termination by either party, this Agreement shall be deemed to be renewed on January 1, 200~~6~~ for a further one-year period.

Details of the above services are as follows:

- Office visit includes full physical examination and minor treatment such as clipping, cleaning a wound, evaluating requirements for further care, discussion with BAS, and prescribing medication if the animal is stable enough not to require hospitalization.
- After Hours is defined as outside of regular clinic hours Mon. to Fri. 8 am-7 pm, and 9 am to noon on Saturday.
- Medications are defined as prescription or other medications required for the animal. Supplies may include bandage materials, E-collars, suture etc.
- Hospitalization is defined as one full day, 24 hours, or part thereof, of professional care and includes the kennel fee.
- Surgery fee is for 10 minutes of actual surgical time.
- Hospital unit for major treatment would be charged for more extensive treatments than can be done in the office visit ie. catheterizing a blocked cat, treating a severe degloving injury.
- Anesthetic as listed here is defined as injectable anesthetic for short procedures. This places the animals under general anesthetic. For longer procedures inhalant gas anesthetic is required, and \$16.00 per 15 minutes will be added if this is required.
- Sedative IM is an intramuscular injection for sedation only. This may be required to calm a fractious animal, or to allow treatment of a painful area.
- Sedative IV is an intravenous injection for sedation.
- IV Fluids (intravenous fluids). This fee includes the intravenous catheterization procedure, the catheter, the fluid line and intravenous bag, and bandaging required for protecting the area.
- Daytime or overnight board is for kennel care, walking, feeding, cleaning etc for a 24 hour period or part thereof.
- Radiographs includes the set up, radiographing, developing and interpretation for 2 views of one location of an animal.

RABIES VACCINATION PROGRAM

This Provision of Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is effective as of January 1, 2006, and is between

Dervetco Holding Ltd.
(hereinafter the "Participant")

WHEREAS Brampton Animal Services ("BAS") and the Participant and various other veterinary clinics in the City of Brampton (the "Other Participants") have established a working relationship to ensure rabies vaccines are accessible to all animals in Brampton, particularly those animals belonging to people who are on Government subsidies, through the Rabies vaccination program;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and the Other Participants are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association;

AND WHEREAS the parties wish to formalize this working relationship by entering into an agreement, and the parties acknowledge that any previous arrangements or agreements regarding the content of this Agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

Rabies Vaccination Program

1. The Participant will provide rabies vaccines to domestic animals brought in by residents of Brampton, for a fee of \$10.00, throughout a one-year term starting in January (the "Rabies program").
2. The Rabies Vaccination Program will only be available to Brampton residents who receive Government subsidy.
3. BAS will issue a voucher to residents who are eligible for the Rabies Program after determining the citizen relies on government subsidy.
4. Citizens will be able to obtain a vaccine at any time during the year, during normal business hours of the Participant with a scheduled appointment.

5. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City with an updated list of the Participants in the Rabies Vaccination program before November of each year of the term of this Agreement.
6. The Participant will inform all veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.

Indemnity and Insurance


7. The Participant shall indemnify, save harmless and release the City, and all those for whom it is in law responsible, from any and all claims, causes of action, suits, proceedings, or obligations, for any losses, damages, including bodily injury (and including death) or costs, and reasonable legal fees, both direct or indirect, howsoever and whatsoever incurred, suffered or sustained in connection with the Participant's operations under this Agreement, unless caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the City.
8. It is understood by the Participant and the City that all parties to this Agreement have in place sufficient insurance to protect the parties in relation to their operations and the indemnification of other parties under this Agreement.


Termination

AND WHEREAS the Participant and Other Participants are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and the City wish to enter into this agreement to formalize their relationship, and acknowledge that any previous agreements or arrangements regarding the content of this agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

General Administration

1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. 1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. The 20% discount for the City will remain in place despite any changes to the Fees. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City of Brampton with any adjustments to the Fee schedule.
16. Any citizen who comes to the Participant during BAS hours with a Stray Animal not needing medical attention should be referred to BAS, and BAS will pick up the animal during BAS's regular hours.
17. Any citizen who comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal not in need of medical attention after BAS hours of operation, will be advised to make every attempt to assure the animal is comfortable and safe. BAS will pick up the animal during its regular hours of operation.
18. If the Stray Animal requires only minor treatments (ie. treatment for ear mites) that can be handled by BAS, the Participant will permit the Stray Animal to be treated by BAS.
19. The City will not be responsible for any fees, including, but not limited to overnight hospitalization, and boarding, on healthy Stray Animals that are examined or admitted during regular BAS hours.
20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where
 - The animal is still under the care of the Participant
 - The animal was under veterinary care and has since deceased
 - The animal has been returned to BAS
22. The Participant must provide BAS, as soon as possible with as much detail as possible, including the citizen's name, address, telephone numbers, the animal's description and health status, and the time, date and location the Stray Animal was found.
23. The Participant shall make an attempt to collect Fees from the owner if the owner attends the Participant's clinic. The owner will not receive a 20% discount on the Fees.
24. At the time the Stray Animal is discharged to BAS, an itemized invoice should accompany the animal. A brief medical report should also accompany the animal, which includes pertinent medical findings, ongoing treatment, and recommendations.

25. BAS will provide:

- a. The removal of all Stray Animals after the redemption period (3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays).
- b. Payment (net 45 days) upon receiving invoice with no late payment or interest charges being applied to the invoice.

Wild Animals

26. BAS will not take responsibility for wild animals. The Participant can treat or euthanise the wild animal at the Participant's discretion, at the Participant's expense. If the Participant contacts BAS, an officer will pick up the wild animal.

Adopted Animals

27. For all animals adopted from BAS, the first visit to a Participant for a check-up will be free of charge if it is held within 96 hours of the adoption of the animal.
28. As part of this check-up, the Participant will establish the early health status of the animal and provide a sound health program (including a vaccination schedule) to be outlined for the new pet owner.

General Administration

1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. The 20% discount for the City will remain in place despite any changes to the Fees. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City of Brampton with any adjustments to the Fee schedule.
16. Any citizen who comes to the Participant during BAS hours with a Stray Animal not needing medical attention should be referred to BAS, and BAS will pick up the animal during BAS's regular hours.
17. Any citizen who comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal not in need of medical attention after BAS hours of operation, will be advised to make every attempt to assure the animal is comfortable and safe. BAS will pick up the animal during its regular hours of operation.
18. If the Stray Animal requires only minor treatments (ie. treatment for ear mites) that can be handled by BAS, the Participant will permit the Stray Animal to be treated by BAS.
19. The City will not be responsible for any fees, including, but not limited to overnight hospitalization, and boarding, on healthy Stray Animals that are examined or admitted during regular BAS hours.
20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where
 - The animal is still under the care of the Participant
 - The animal was under veterinary care and has since deceased
 - The animal has been returned to BAS
22. The Participant must provide BAS, as soon as possible with as much detail as possible, including the citizen's name, address, telephone numbers, the animal's description and health status, and the time, date and location the Stray Animal was found.
23. The Participant shall make an attempt to collect Fees from the owner if the owner attends the Participant's clinic. The owner will not receive a 20% discount on the Fees.
24. At the time the Stray Animal is discharged to BAS, an itemized invoice should accompany the animal. A brief medical report should also accompany the animal, which includes pertinent medical findings, ongoing treatment, and recommendations.

25. BAS will provide:

- a. The removal of all Stray Animals after the redemption period (3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays).
- b. Payment (net 45 days) upon receiving invoice with no late payment or interest charges being applied to the invoice.

Wild Animals

26. BAS will not take responsibility for wild animals. The Participant can treat or euthanise the wild animal at the Participant's discretion, at the Participant's expense. If the Participant contacts BAS, an officer will pick up the wild animal.

Adopted Animals

27. For all animals adopted from BAS, the first visit to a Participant for a check-up will be free of charge if it is held within 96 hours of the adoption of the animal.

28. As part of this check-up, the Participant will establish the early health status of the animal and provide a sound health program (including a vaccination schedule) to be outlined for the new pet owner.

Details of the above services are as follows:

- Office visit includes full physical examination and minor treatment such as clipping, cleaning a wound, evaluating requirements for further care, discussion with BAS, and prescribing medication if the animal is stable enough not to require hospitalization.
- After Hours is defined as outside of regular clinic hours Mon. to Fri. 8 am-7 pm, and 9 am to noon on Saturday.
- Medications are defined as prescription or other medications required for the animal. Supplies may include bandage materials, E-collars, suture etc.
- Hospitalization is defined as one full day, 24 hours, or part thereof, of professional care and includes the kennel fee.
- Surgery fee is for 10 minutes of actual surgical time.
- Hospital unit for major treatment would be charged for more extensive treatments than can be done in the office visit ie. catheterizing a blocked cat, treating a severe degloving injury.

5. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City with an updated list of the Participants in the Rabies Vaccination program before November of each year of the term of this Agreement.
6. The Participant will inform all veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.

PROVISION OF SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Provision of Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is effective as of January 1, 2006, and is between

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON
(hereinafter the "City")

and

Lakeridge Animal Hospital
(hereinafter the "Participant")

WHEREAS Brampton Animal Services ("BAS") and the Participant and various other veterinary clinics in the City of Brampton (the "Other Participants") have established relationships to ensure the medical care, safety and comfort of stray animals in Brampton in accordance with the City's by-laws and provincial legislation;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and Other Participants are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and the City wish to enter into this agreement to formalize their relationship, and acknowledge that any previous agreements or arrangements regarding the content of this agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

General Administration

1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. The 20% discount for the City will remain in place despite any changes to the Fees. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City of Brampton with any adjustments to the Fee schedule.
16. Any citizen who comes to the Participant during BAS hours with a Stray Animal not needing medical attention should be referred to BAS, and BAS will pick up the animal during BAS's regular hours.
17. Any citizen who comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal not in need of medical attention after BAS hours of operation, will be advised to make every attempt to assure the animal is comfortable and safe. BAS will pick up the animal during its regular hours of operation.
18. If the Stray Animal requires only minor treatments (ie. treatment for ear mites) that can be handled by BAS, the Participant will permit the Stray Animal to be treated by BAS.
19. The City will not be responsible for any fees, including, but not limited to overnight hospitalization, and boarding, on healthy Stray Animals that are examined or admitted during regular BAS hours.
20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where
 - The animal is still under the care of the Participant
 - The animal was under veterinary care and has since deceased
 - The animal has been returned to BAS
22. The Participant must provide BAS, as soon as possible with as much detail as possible, including the citizen's name, address, telephone numbers, the animal's description and health status, and the time, date and location the Stray Animal was found.
23. The Participant shall make an attempt to collect Fees from the owner if the owner attends the Participant's clinic. The owner will not receive a 20% discount on the Fees.
24. At the time the Stray Animal is discharged to BAS, an itemized invoice should accompany the animal. A brief medical report should also accompany the animal, which includes pertinent medical findings, ongoing treatment, and recommendations.

25. BAS will provide:

- a. The removal of all Stray Animals after the redemption period (3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays).
- b. Payment (net 45 days) upon receiving invoice with no late payment or interest charges being applied to the invoice.

Wild Animals

26. BAS will not take responsibility for wild animals. The Participant can treat or euthanise the wild animal at the Participant's discretion, at the Participant's expense. If the Participant contacts BAS, an officer will pick up the wild animal.

Adopted Animals

27. For all animals adopted from BAS, the first visit to a Participant for a check-up will be free of charge if it is held within 96 hours of the adoption of the animal.
28. As part of this check-up, the Participant will establish the early health status of the animal and provide a sound health program (including a vaccination schedule) to be outlined for the new pet owner.
29. BAS will not steer owners of newly adopted animals to a particular veterinary clinic, the Participant or Other Participants. People who have adopted animals from BAS are not required to use a veterinarian, the Participant or Other Participants in Brampton for the free exam.

Indemnity and Insurance

30. The Participant shall indemnify, save harmless and release the City, and all those for whom it is in law responsible, from any and all claims, causes of action, suits, proceedings, or obligations, for any losses, damages, including bodily injury (and including death) or costs, and reasonable legal fees, both direct or indirect, howsoever and whatsoever incurred, suffered or sustained in connection with the Participant's operations under this Agreement, unless caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the City.


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



Details of the above services are as follows:

- Office visit includes full physical examination and minor treatment such as clipping, cleaning a wound, evaluating requirements for further care, discussion with BAS, and prescribing medication if the animal is stable enough not to require hospitalization.
- After Hours is defined as outside of regular clinic hours Mon. to Fri. 8 am-7 pm, and 9 am to noon on Saturday.
- Medications are defined as prescription or other medications required for the animal. Supplies may include bandage materials, E-collars, suture etc.
- Hospitalization is defined as one full day, 24 hours, or part thereof, of professional care and includes the kennel fee.
- Surgery fee is for 10 minutes of actual surgical time.
- Hospital unit for major treatment would be charged for more extensive treatments than can be done in the office visit ie. catheterizing a blocked cat, treating a severe degloving injury.
- Anesthetic as listed here is defined as injectable anesthetic for short procedures. This places the animals under general anesthetic. For longer procedures inhalant gas anesthetic is required, and \$16.00 per 15 minutes will be added if this is required.
- Sedative IM is an intramuscular injection for sedation only. This may be required to calm a fractious animal, or to allow treatment of a painful area.
- Sedative IV is an intravenous injection for sedation.
- IV Fluids (intravenous fluids). This fee includes the intravenous catheterization procedure, the catheter, the fluid line and intravenous bag, and bandaging required for protecting the area.
- Daytime or overnight board is for kennel care, walking, feeding, cleaning etc for a 24 hour period or part thereof.
- Radiographs includes the set up, radiographing, developing and interpretation for 2 views of one location of an animal.

2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").

13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

Details of the above services are as follows:

- Office visit includes full physical examination and minor treatment such as clipping, cleaning a wound, evaluating requirements for further care, discussion with BAS, and prescribing medication if the animal is stable enough not to require hospitalization.
- After Hours is defined as outside of regular clinic hours Mon. to Fri. 8 am-7 pm, and 9 am to noon on Saturday.
- Medications are defined as prescription or other medications required for the animal. Supplies may include bandage materials, E-collars, suture etc.
- Hospitalization is defined as one full day, 24 hours, or part thereof, of professional care and includes the kennel fee.
- Surgery fee is for 10 minutes of actual surgical time.
- Hospital unit for major treatment would be charged for more extensive treatments than can be done in the office visit ie. catheterizing a blocked cat, treating a severe degloving injury.
- Anesthetic as listed here is defined as injectable anesthetic for short procedures. This places the animals under general anesthetic. For longer procedures inhalant gas anesthetic is required, and \$16.00 per 15 minutes will be added if this is required.

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

Rabies Vaccination Program

1. The Participant will provide rabies vaccines to domestic animals brought in by residents of Brampton, for a fee of \$10.00, throughout a one-year term starting in January (the "Rabies program").
2. The Rabies Vaccination Program will only be available to Brampton residents who receive Government subsidy.
3. BAS will issue a voucher to residents who are eligible for the Rabies Program after determining the citizen relies on government subsidy.





AND WHEREAS the Participant and the City wish to enter into this agreement to formalize their relationship, and acknowledge that any previous agreements or arrangements regarding the content of this agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

General Administration

1. The Participant will inform other veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.
2. BAS will provide all of its Animal Control Officers with a list of including the Participant and Other Participants, and the relevant hours of operation and phone numbers of each.
3. The clinic of the Participant will be open during the hours indicated to BAS, or they will provide the name of an alternative clinic that will be open during those hours.
4. BAS will transport animals to the Participant and Other Participants between 8:00am to 7:00pm, Mondays to Fridays, and between 9:00am to 2:00pm on Saturdays.
5. BAS will phone the Participant and Other Participants before the delivery of an animal.

6. BAS hours of operation and contact information is as provided on Schedule "A" to this Agreement.

Provision of Feed and Prescription Drugs

7. The Participant agrees to supply BAS with necessary prescription drugs (T-61, vaccines, etc) and feed through its medical supplier as required by the BAS Animal Health Technician and as permitted by C.V.O. standards, and will invoice BAS on a monthly basis, as required. All necessary record keeping, supervision and liaison with the BAS Animal Health Technician remains the responsibility of the Participant.

Consulting Services

8. The Participant shall have a veterinarian available to BAS for consultation on animal health care. This will take place on a rotational basis from Participant to Other Participants. The rotation schedule will be provided by the Brampton Veterinary Association. A minimum fee of \$181.90 (less discount of 20%) per hour or part thereof will apply for consultation when a veterinarian is required to visit BAS. Consultation includes, but is not limited to, examining animals, training shelter staff, or liaising with the Shelter Supervisor, the Manager of Animal Control or designate, as required. In addition, the Participant will be reimbursed for the kilometres driven from the Clinic to the BAS at the rate of \$0.40 per kilometre.

Stray Animals

9. Stray animals are any animals found by a citizen (other than the owner of the animal) within the limits of the City of Brampton ("Stray Animal").
10. Stray Animals may be healthy, injured or diseased.
11. Any Stray Animals brought to the Participant that appear to require medical attention must be examined by a veterinarian, and provided with the necessary care to maintain them in a comfortable condition for the entire time the Stray Animal remains at the Participant's clinic or until the redemption period expires. The redemption period is 3 business days, not including the intake date, exclusive of Sundays and Statutory holidays.
12. If a Stray Animal requires emergency veterinary care outside of the business hours of the Participant's clinics, BAS will transport the animal to either of the two following clinics, which provide overnight emergency services:

Emergency Veterinary Clinic – 1 Wexford Road located on Highway 10 & Wexford, or
North Town Veterinary Hospital 496 Main Street– located at Highway 10 & Williams Pkwy
13. If a citizen comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal needing medical attention, the treatment of that animal by the Clinic will be subject the fees set out in Schedule "B" to this Agreement (the "Fees").
14. All Fees payable by the City pursuant to this Agreement will be subject to a 20% discount.

15. The Fees will be adjusted annually based on the recommendations contained in the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association Fee Guideline. The 20% discount for the City will remain in place despite any changes to the Fees. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City of Brampton with any adjustments to the Fee schedule.
16. Any citizen who comes to the Participant during BAS hours with a Stray Animal not needing medical attention should be referred to BAS, and BAS will pick up the animal during BAS's regular hours.
17. Any citizen who comes to the Participant with a Stray Animal not in need of medical attention after BAS hours of operation, will be advised to make every attempt to assure the animal is comfortable and safe. BAS will pick up the animal during its regular hours of operation.
18. If the Stray Animal requires only minor treatments (ie. treatment for ear mites) that can be handled by BAS, the Participant will permit the Stray Animal to be treated by BAS.
19. The City will not be responsible for any fees, including, but not limited to overnight hospitalization, and boarding, on healthy Stray Animals that are examined or admitted during regular BAS hours.
20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where

 - The animal was under veterinary care and has since deceased
 - The animal has been returned to BAS
22. The Participant must provide BAS, as soon as possible with as much detail as possible, including the citizen's name, address, telephone numbers, the animal's description and health status, and the time, date and location the Stray Animal was found.
23. The Participant shall make an attempt to collect Fees from the owner if the owner attends the Participant's clinic. The owner will not receive a 20% discount on the Fees.
24. At the time the Stray Animal is discharged to BAS, an itemized invoice should accompany the animal. A brief medical report should also accompany the animal, which includes pertinent medical findings, ongoing treatment, and recommendations.

20. After regular BAS hours, only when a diligent attempt has been made to contact BAS and there is no response to that contact, and the citizen cannot or will not keep the healthy Stray Animal overnight, will a fee for board apply.
21. The City accepts financial responsibility for the Fees, in accordance with this Agreement, for any injured or diseased Stray Animal brought to a Participant's clinic for medical attention by BAS or by a concerned citizen under the following conditions.
 - a. If no owner is identified. The Participant agrees to attempt to determine ownership by scanning the animal for a microchip and obtaining as much information as possible about the animal and complete the standard admittance form provided by BAS.
 - b. The owner of an animal is identified and refuses to pay any or all fees charged by the Participant where
 - The animal is still under the care of the Participant
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Adopted Animals

27. For all animals adopted from BAS, the first visit to a Participant for a check-up will be free of charge if it is held within 96 hours of the adoption of the animal.



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



Details of the above services are as follows:

- Office visit includes full physical examination and minor treatment such as clipping, cleaning a wound, evaluating requirements for further care, discussion with BAS, and prescribing medication if the animal is stable enough not to require hospitalization.
- After Hours is defined as outside of regular clinic hours Mon. to Fri. 8 am-7 pm, and 9 am to noon on Saturday.
- Medications are defined as prescription or other medications required for the animal. Supplies may include bandage materials, E-collars, suture etc.
- Hospitalization is defined as one full day, 24 hours, or part thereof, of professional care and includes the kennel fee.
- Surgery fee is for 10 minutes of actual surgical time.
- Hospital unit for major treatment would be charged for more extensive treatments than can be done in the office visit ie. catheterizing a blocked cat, treating a severe degloving injury.
- Anesthetic as listed here is defined as injectable anesthetic for short procedures. This places the animals under general anesthetic. For longer procedures inhalant gas anesthetic is required, and \$16.00 per 15 minutes will be added if this is required.
- Sedative IM is an intramuscular injection for sedation only. This may be required to calm a fractious animal, or to allow treatment of a painful area.
- Sedative IV is an intravenous injection for sedation.
- IV Fluids (intravenous fluids). This fee includes the intravenous catheterization procedure, the catheter, the fluid line and intravenous bag, and bandaging required for protecting the area.
- Daytime or overnight board is for kennel care, walking, feeding, cleaning etc for a 24 hour period or part thereof.
- Radiographs includes the set up, radiographing, developing and interpretation for 2 views of one location of an animal.

PROVISION OF SERVICES AGREEMENT

RABIES VACCINATION PROGRAM

This Provision of Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is effective as of January 1, 2006, and is between

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON
(hereinafter the "City")

and

Bramvet Ltd.
(hereinafter the "Participant")

WHEREAS Brampton Animal Services ("BAS") and the Participant and various other veterinary clinics in the City of Brampton (the "Other Participants") have established a working relationship to ensure rabies vaccines are accessible to all animals in Brampton, particularly those animals belonging to people who are on Government subsidies, through the Rabies vaccination program;

AND WHEREAS the Participant and the Other Participants are members of the Brampton Veterinary Association;

AND WHEREAS the parties wish to formalize this working relationship by entering into an agreement, and the parties acknowledge that any previous arrangements or agreements regarding the content of this Agreement are hereby terminated;

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement witnesses that, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged), the parties agree as follows.

Rabies Vaccination Program

1. The Participant will provide rabies vaccines to domestic animals brought in by residents of Brampton, for a fee of \$10.00, throughout a one-year term starting in January (the "Rabies program").
2. The Rabies Vaccination Program will only be available to Brampton residents who receive Government subsidy.
3. BAS will issue a voucher to residents who are eligible for the Rabies Program after determining the citizen relies on government subsidy.
4. Citizens will be able to obtain a vaccine at any time during the year, during normal business hours of the Participant with a scheduled appointment.

5. The Brampton Veterinary Association will provide the City with an updated list of the Participants in the Rabies Vaccination program before November of each year of the term of this Agreement.
6. The Participant will inform all veterinarians at the clinic as to the content of this Agreement.

Indemnity and Insurance


