



THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRAMPTON

BY-LAW

Number 98 - 2025

To amend the Traffic and Parking By-law 93-93, as amended, related to Section 26 (Heavy Trucks);

WHEREAS the Council for The Corporation of the City of Brampton has adopted the Traffic and Parking By-law No. 93-93, ("By-law 93-93") as amended to regulate the use of highways and parking in the City of Brampton;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 11 (3) 1 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, a by-law may be passed by a council of a municipality relating to the regulation of highways and parking within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton is desirous of adopting a by-law to further amend the Traffic and Parking By-law 93-93, as amended, related to Section 26 (Heavy Trucks);

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:


1. That subsection 26(2) of By-law 93-93, as amended, be DELETED and replaced with the following:

"26. (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to any vehicle actually engaged in making delivery or a collection from premises which cannot be reached except by way of a highway or a portion of highway referred to in the said section or to prohibit the use of such vehicles, for such purposes, provided that:


- (a) in making such delivery or collection, the said highway or portion of highway is travelled only insofar as is unavoidable in getting to and from such premises;
- (b) a valid bill of lading is produced upon demand by an officer at the time of inspection; and,
- (c) the delivery to or collection from such premises is for purposes that are permitted by Zoning By-law 270-2004, as amended, and other applicable legal requirements."
