TRANSFORMING HEALTH CARE IN BRAMPTON

As we embrace the fall season, Brampton continues to shine as a healthy, vibrant, and caring city. From major healthcare milestones to community celebrations, our progress reflects the strength of teamwork and shared vision.

This summer, the sold-out Hockey Night in Brampton brought fans together to cheer on NHL stars and raise funds for William Osler Health System and the city's new \$2.4 billion hospital — a vital project that will transform healthcare in our community.

Under Ontario's hospital funding model, municipalities contribute a "local share" toward new hospital builds. For Brampton's second hospital, the City's responsibilities include:

- 10% of total project costs (local share)
- Funding furniture, fixtures, and equipment

Fall 2025 also marked the opening of Toronto Metropolitan University's Medical School — the first in the GTA in over a century. This achievement will train the next generation of healthcare leaders right here in Brampton and the newly released Federal Budget just announced \$25M in capital funding to TMU for another student building!

Together, through collaboration and commitment, we are building a stronger, healthier, and more connected city. Also, we are making progress on securing a new Regional Cancer Care Centre for Brampton. There's more exciting news to come on that project, stay tuned!

Fifteen years later, that dream became reality with the opening of Peel Memorial Hospital. Built by the community, for the community, it quickly became a place of hope, healing and compassion.

Now, 100 years later, that same spirit of boldness and generosity lives on.

On March 28, 2025, we broke ground on Brampton's second hospital. More than just a ceremonial moment, this was a celebration of community resolve, visionary leadership, and a shared belief that health care should grow with the city

it serves. With support from all levels of government, early transformational donors, and the people of Brampton, this dream is becoming real once again.

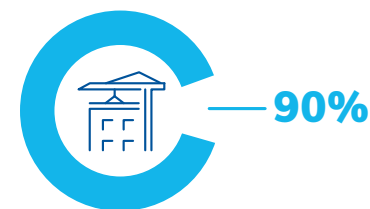

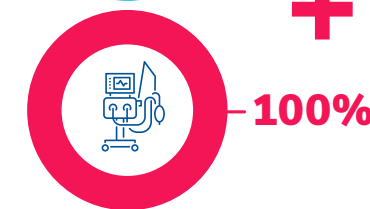
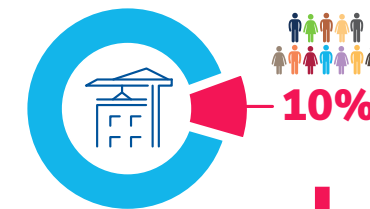
In October 2025, the Ontario government, through Infrastructure Ontario (IO), and Osler announced the start of the next phase of development for this project. **Bird Design-Build Construction Inc.** has been selected as the development partner to advance the project requirements, including the design, construction schedule and pricing. As with any large-scale construction projects, key dates are subject to change, pending additional approvals.

When it is finished, the new Peel Memorial Hospital will have many services all in one place. This will include the new ED, hospital beds, clinics, diagnostic tests, surgery, and more. For patients in Brampton, this means more care close to home and less travel.

Why is community fundraising so important?



In Ontario, the **GOVERNMENT** funds **90%** of hospital construction.



The **COMMUNITY** contributes the other **10%**, plus **100%** of equipment, technology, furniture, and other essentials.

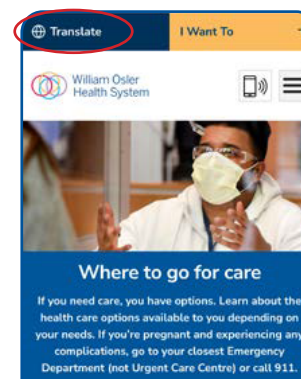
This is called the “**local share**” and it's how we work together to build the hospital our community deserves.

SUPPORTING A HEALTHY CITY: A NEW MEDICAL SCHOOL IN BRAMPTON

I'm proud to share that this fall marked a historic moment for health care in our city. Toronto Metropolitan University's new School of Medicine — Ontario's first new medical school in 20 years — is opened right here in Brampton.

With nearly \$180 million in provincial investment, this state-of-the-art campus welcomed its first 176 students this September. When it reaches full capacity, it will offer 94 undergraduate seats each year and 117 postgraduate training positions. That means more home-grown physicians trained in Brampton, strengthening our health care system for decades to come.

BEST OF THE BEST CHOSEN

Admission criteria is difficult for applicants with only approximately 1.5% of students being accepted (ex: Harvard Medical School accepts approximately 3% of applicants annually). With an intake of upwards of 6,000 applicants and with the highest standard of admission criteria in the country, Brampton's Medical School will ensure only the brightest medical minds in Canada are chosen for enrollment.



"This investment is about more than a building — it's about better access to care for Brampton families. Students at the TMU School of Medicine will also gain hands-on experience through new and expanded primary-care teaching clinics in high-need communities, increasing both training opportunities and local access to care.

Since 2018, Ontario has added nearly 100,000 new nurses and more than 15,000 new physicians. The new TMU School of Medicine is an important part of that growth, ensuring we train the next generation of doctors right here in our city.

Brampton deserves a strong, sustainable health care system, and the opening of this medical school is a major step toward that goal. I look forward to welcoming these students and future health care leaders to our community."

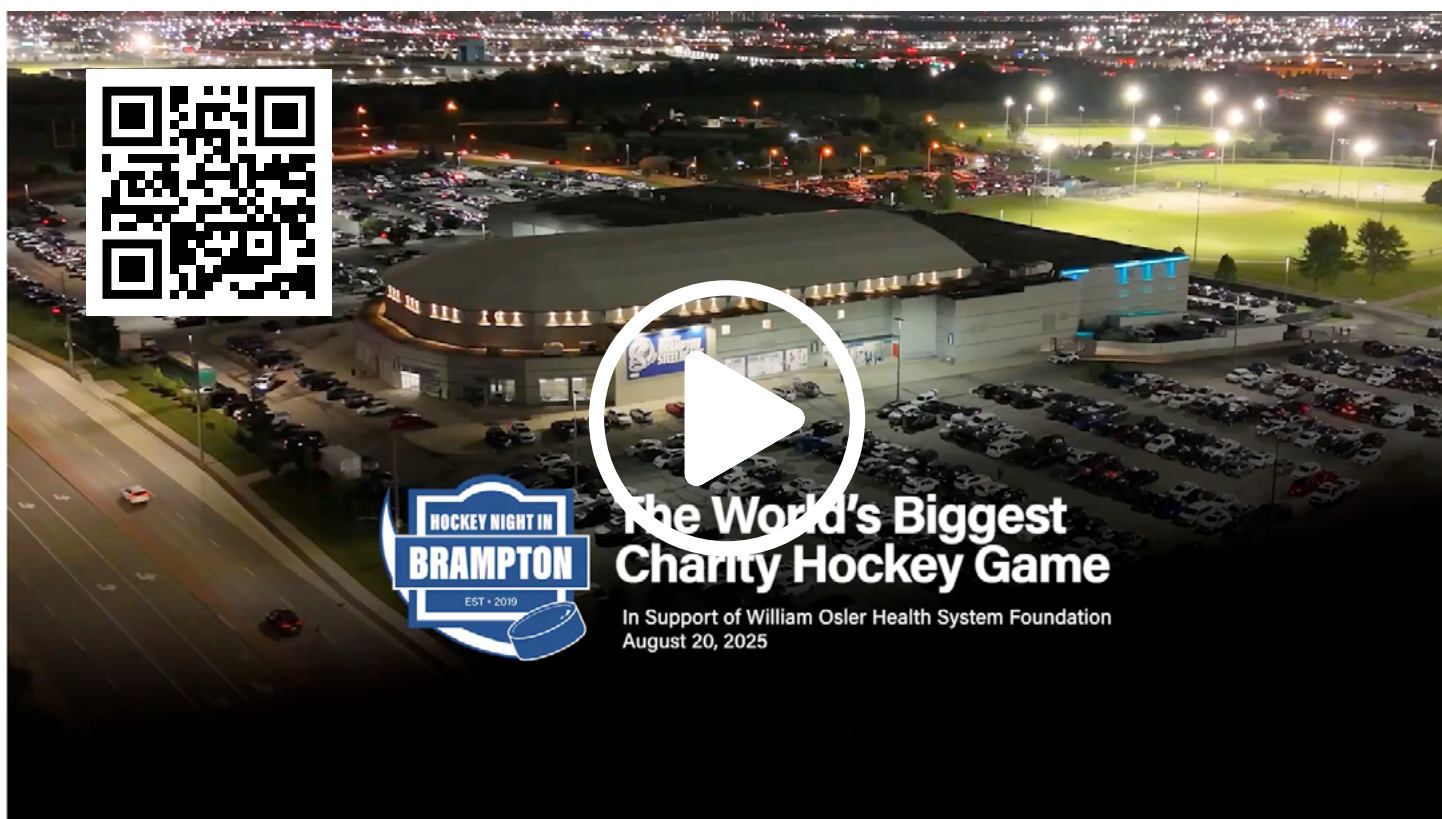
