DOWNTOWN BRAMPTON REVITALIZATION

The City's downtown revitalization efforts are progressing at an exciting pace, with several transformational projects already underway. Streetscape work along Main and Queen Streets includes the removal of the existing sidewalk, expansion of the boulevard, new infrastructure installation, new traffic signals and installation of granite pavers and curbs, with phased work continuing through 2027.

In September, an international design competition was launched for the redevelopment of Ken Whillans and

Garden Squares, inviting top architectural firms from around the world to compete for the opportunity to shape the transformation of these spaces into world-class civic hubs.

ROSALEA PARK - NEW WINTER TENNIS DOME

The City is thrilled to announce the completion of the new Rosalea Park Youth Winter Tennis Dome! This exciting project features three new high-quality asphalt acrylic tennis courts, covered by a seasonal winter dome to support the growing demand for youth tennis programs. Enhancements include upgraded parking to meet community needs and new planted trees. Select tennis programs are now open for registration through Premier Racquet Club Brampton and City recreation programs will begin in January. Don't miss this opportunity to stay active this winter! THIRD TRANSIT FACILITY BREAKS GROUND

Situated at Highway 50 and Cadetta Road, Brampton Transit's new maintenance and storage facility will be named the Cadetta Johnston Transit Facility, honouring the Johnston family. The Johnston family's historical ties to the area date back to the early 19th Century and the facility's commemorative naming recognizes their significant contributions. Construction is underway and expected to be completed in 2027. The new facility is essential to support the continued growth of the bus fleet and will significantly enhance Brampton's capacity to meet the city's growing transit needs. The first phase of the new facility will be approximately 460,000 sq. ft. and is expected to house approximately 250 buses. It will be designed to accommodate future electrification, pending additional funding. Learn more at brampton.ca/transitfacility



LICENSING, CREATING SAFER RENTALS FOR ALL


Brampton's two-year Residential Rental Licensing Pilot Program requires rental properties with four or fewer units in Wards 1, 3, 4, 5 and 7 to obtain a business licence. These central wards were selected due to historically high rental violations. The program aims to protect the health, safety and human rights of residents while preserving neighbourhood integrity. Its goals include maintaining neighbourhood character, upholding property standards bylaws and ensuring the safety of individuals and families through Ontario Fire Code enforcement. WILLIAMS PARKWAY REDEVELOPMENT GOES GREEN

The redevelopment of Williams Parkway will meet the needs of all Brampton residents, regardless of age or ability, featuring multi-use pathways for pedestrians, cyclists, scooters, transit and drivers. Improvements to Williams Parkway include enhanced streetscaping and lighting on boulevards, trees and a centre median planting.

The first phase of work, from McLaughlin Road to Kennedy Road, started in Fall 2024. The second phase of work, from Dixie Road to Hwy 410, is set to begin in 2025, concluding with work on Hwy 410 to Kennedy Road in 2026. An Adaptive Traffic Control System will optimize traffic signal timings, to be adjusted in real-time, to increase green times for vehicles where needed.



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW WHEN IT SNOWS

Winter crews begin plowing major roads first, when there is five centimetres of snow, then plow local roads. Parking on streets is not allowed and any previously issued permits are invalid. Illegally parked vehicles may be tagged, towed and impounded at the owner's expense. Penalties for parked vehicles interfering with snow removal and/or winter maintenance are:

- first offence: \$125
- second offence: \$250
- subsequent offences: \$500

Residents must clear snow and ice from their sidewalks by 11 am the day after the end of a snowfall. To help seniors and people with disabilities, who not only own, but also rent property, the City has expanded its Financial Assistance Program. Learn more at **brampton.ca/snow**

MAKE IT A FIRE-SAFE DECEMBER TO REMEMBER!

Make this December fire-safe! Brampton Fire reminds residents to stay alert: use outdoor-rated LED lights, water live trees daily, stay candle safe, test smoke/CO alarms, use extension cords as temporary use only, never leave cooking unattended, have a home escape plan, give portable heaters space and monitor lithium-ion devices to prevent overcharging. This includes addressing property standards, landlord licensing, enhancing road safety with traffic calming and speed enforcement and strengthening community safety through improved by-law enforcement. Your concerns drive these efforts to improve our neighbourhoods.



SUPPORTING YOUTH

As Chair of Community Services, I've championed spaces for youth to thrive: Youth Hubs, Atiba Hutchinson Soccer Courts, prioritized tennis programming for youth and the first ever hack-a-thon for young innovators. I am also proud to lead a Youth Council of nearly 300 dedicated youth who actively contribute and strengthen our community.



DRIVING CHANGE AT COUNCIL

Motions I have brought forward at Council address key priorities and issues to include, but not limited to, prioritizing safe public spaces for all, neighbourhood associations, support for transitional housing for women, addressing speeding and reckless driving, an operational review and plan for improved bylaw enforcement, free recreation programs for seniors and youth mental health resources. 
BREAKING GROUND FOR BRAMPTON'S THIRD TRANSIT FACILITY
