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Dear friends,

As we welcome the summer season and the various activities that accompany it, we wanted to provide you updates on the City of Brampton's downtown revitalization efforts. These projects will bring us closer to realizing the potential of our Downtown and making it a vibrant space for all residents to enjoy.

Region of Peel Phase 1 Watermain/Sanitary Sewer Replacement and Roadwork: This project is currently in progress and is the Region of Peel's capital project for the replacement and rehabilitation of various small-diameter watermains, sanitary sewers and storm sewers. The full-depth road reconstruction at 11 separate locations along Queen Street East and West and Main Street North and South are at 99% completion. Phase 2 of the watermain/sanitary sewer replacement and roadwork started in April 2024 which is further west on Queen Street, between McLaughlin Road South and McMurchy Avenue South.

Downtown Partial Streetscaping Works: As the second part of the Region of Peel Phase 1 Watermain/Sanitary Sewer Replacement and Roadwork, the City is working on the above-ground streetscaping on Queen Street (between Mill Street South to Chapel Street) and Main Street (between Nelson Street West to Wellington Street). The Streetscape Project is tentatively planned to begin on Queen Street West in Fall 2024. A temporary asphalt road resurfacing along Main Street was completed in June 2024 to improve road conditions for vehicles and cyclists and to host the Brampton Farmer's Market. It was important for us to keep the Farmer's Market downtown this year and hope to see you throughout the summer visiting the various vendors!

Redevelopment of Garden Square and Ken Whillans Square: City staff is working towards hiring a design team led by an architectural firm for the design and contract administration services for redevelopment of Ken Whillans Square and Garden Square. This process aims to select a multi-disciplinary design team to create word-class, civic spaces that respond to the City's goals and objectives. The redevelopments of Ken Whillans Square and Garden Square are planned for construction in Q3 2025.

Certified Commercial Kitchen: The City is establishing a certified commercial kitchen at 41 George Street South, Suite 103, to provide a leasable, public health-certified commercial kitchen space to chefs, cooks, bakers, private caterers and food entrepreneurs. The certified commercial kitchen will act as a culinary hub and food incubator for downtown Brampton – driving innovative food solutions for the community. Renovations are in progress, and it is anticipated for occupancy in Fall 2024.

Although there is a lot of work happening in the Downtown, the City and local organizations are continuing to host exciting events throughout the summer and we hope that you can take the time to join us for them! For any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact our offices.

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HAVE YOUR SAY ON SNOW REMOVAL SERVICES

Brampton's current winter maintenance service contract for roads, sidewalks and transit stops is being renewed.

Residents are invited to take this important survey because the outcome may change taxes for all households, although not all households will receive the services.

- It would cost about \$2.6 million, an average of \$12 per year, per household in property taxes to clear sidewalks.
- It would cost about \$19.6 million, an average of \$86 per year, per household in property taxes to clear windrows (snow ridges left by snowplows) from driveways.

COMBATTING AUTO THEFT

In recent years, auto thefts have dramatically increased, prompting Brampton to advocate for stronger measures to protect its residents.

As a result, in May 2024, the Federal Government introduced the National Action Plan on Combatting Auto Theft, which identifies various measures, such as improving security and monitoring at Canadian ports, that can be implemented by the Federal, Provincial and Territorial governments.

To assist residents from auto thefts, the City is expanding its giveaway of signal blocking pouches, which may prevent relay attacks by blocking the signal from vehicle key FOBs. SIGN PERMITS

To protect resident safety and maintain community standards, placing signage on hydro poles, traffic poles or along City streets is not permitted in Brampton as per the Sign By-Law. These signs can be a visual distraction to drivers, become a trip hazard for pedestrians and may end up as litter in streets and green spaces. Real estate signs on private property are exempt from this by-law.

Permits must be requested to display signs on buildings or in the ground in Brampton. To request a permit, visit **brampton.ca/signs**



COYOTE SAFETY TIPS

Coyotes are wary of humans and tend to avoid contact as much as possible. It is important to be respectful of their habitats and exercise caution if a coyote is seen.

Tips to remember:

- Keep pets on leashes.
- Always supervise your pets outdoors, even in your backyard.
- Do not feed wildlife.
- Dispose of waste properly so it can't be accessed by wildlife.

If you encounter a coyote:

- Stay calm and don't run.
- Make yourself large and loud.
- Call 9-1-1 if in danger.

- Peel Region waste carts should be clean and not stored street-facing.
- Collection items can be placed after 7 pm the day before and must be removed by 8 pm on collection day.

TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES FOR SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS

To make neighbourhoods safer, the City uses a combination of traffic calming measures to address speeding and reduce excessive traffic volumes.

In 2020, Brampton was one of the first municipalities to implement an Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program. The program now has 50 cameras and will expand capacity with a new regional processing centre and 185 more cameras by 2025.

City Council has also designated 180 Community Safety Zones, established speed cushions in 63 locations and a 40 km/hr Neighbourhood Safety Zone pilot in five neighbourhoods.
