

# MAJOR PROJECTS

## Riverwalk

Long-term flood protection to unlock development potential, while establishing public spaces for people to enjoy. This will allow more residential development, create more jobs, and strengthen the character and identity of the downtown. Construction is expected to start in 2025 and be completed in 2028. The Government of Canada has committed \$38.8M towards the project.

## Enhanced GO Rail Service

Metrolinx is enhancing service and upgrading infrastructure along the Kitchener Line running through Brampton. This will include all-day service, seven days a week, in both directions, with service every 30 minutes during peak times and every 60 minutes off-peak. The Downtown Brampton GO station will have a third track and new platforms.

## Downtown Transit Hub

A new regional transit hub where different modes of transportation come together, while integrating pedestrian-friendly features. An environmental assessment is being initiated this year.

The City is assessing options with government partners to extend the Hurontario Light Rail Transit (HuLRT) from the Brampton Gateway Terminal to the Downtown Brampton GO station.

Metrolinx is advancing rapid transit along the Queen Street-Highway 7 corridor with support from the City of Brampton, Peel Region, and York Region.

## Watermains, Sanitary Sewers and Streetscaping

Construction started in April 2022 and is planned for completion by Spring 2025 to replace/upgrade the Region's infrastructure along Main Street (Nelson St. W. to Wellington St.), Queen Street (Mill St. S. to Chapel St.), James Street, Maple Avenue, and Park Hill Court. In partnership with the Region, the City's work includes repaving the roadway, widening the sidewalks, landscape elements, and street furniture.

## Welcoming Streets

The goal of the Welcoming Streets program is to create a safe, inclusive space for everyone to enjoy in the downtown. Welcoming Streets provides support in situations that do not require police intervention and engages with members of the community to ensure they are connected to the services they need. ## Downtown Bike Hub (Different Spokes)

## Revitalization of the Heritage Theatre Block

The Heritage Theatre Block located at 70-86 Main Street North is on the verge of transformation. The City is engaged in obtaining proposals for the redevelopment, revitalization and operation of the Heritage Theatre Block that align with downtown goals, objectives and priorities. ## Commercial Kitchen

The City is establishing a certified commercial kitchen for chefs, cooks, bakers, private caterers, and food entrepreneurs. Located at 41 George Street South, the space will act as a culinary hub and business incubator for Downtown Brampton.

## Centre for Innovation

The Centre for Innovation (CFI) will be an iconic landmark in Downtown Brampton. The City is currently soliciting innovative ideas and partnership models from prospective proponents that may potentially include a new central library, collaborative space for post-secondary institutions and state of the art office space.



## E-scooters

## Garden Square and Ken Whillans Square

Planned for construction in 2025, the City will be undertaking detailed design and construction for the redevelopment of Garden Square and Ken Whillans Square. The City has committed \$20.9M to the revitalization of these downtown gathering spaces.

## Public Realm Plan and Streetscape Manual

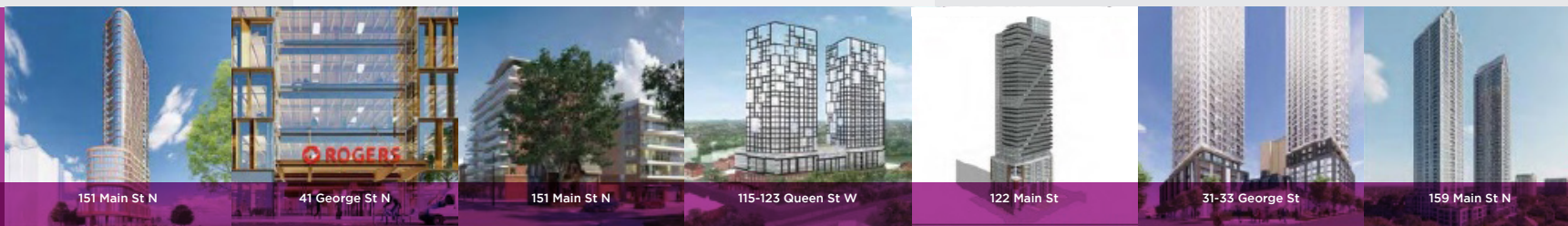
