Downtown Brampton Streetscape Project Queen Street and Main Street

Start Date: September 2024

End Date: December 2027

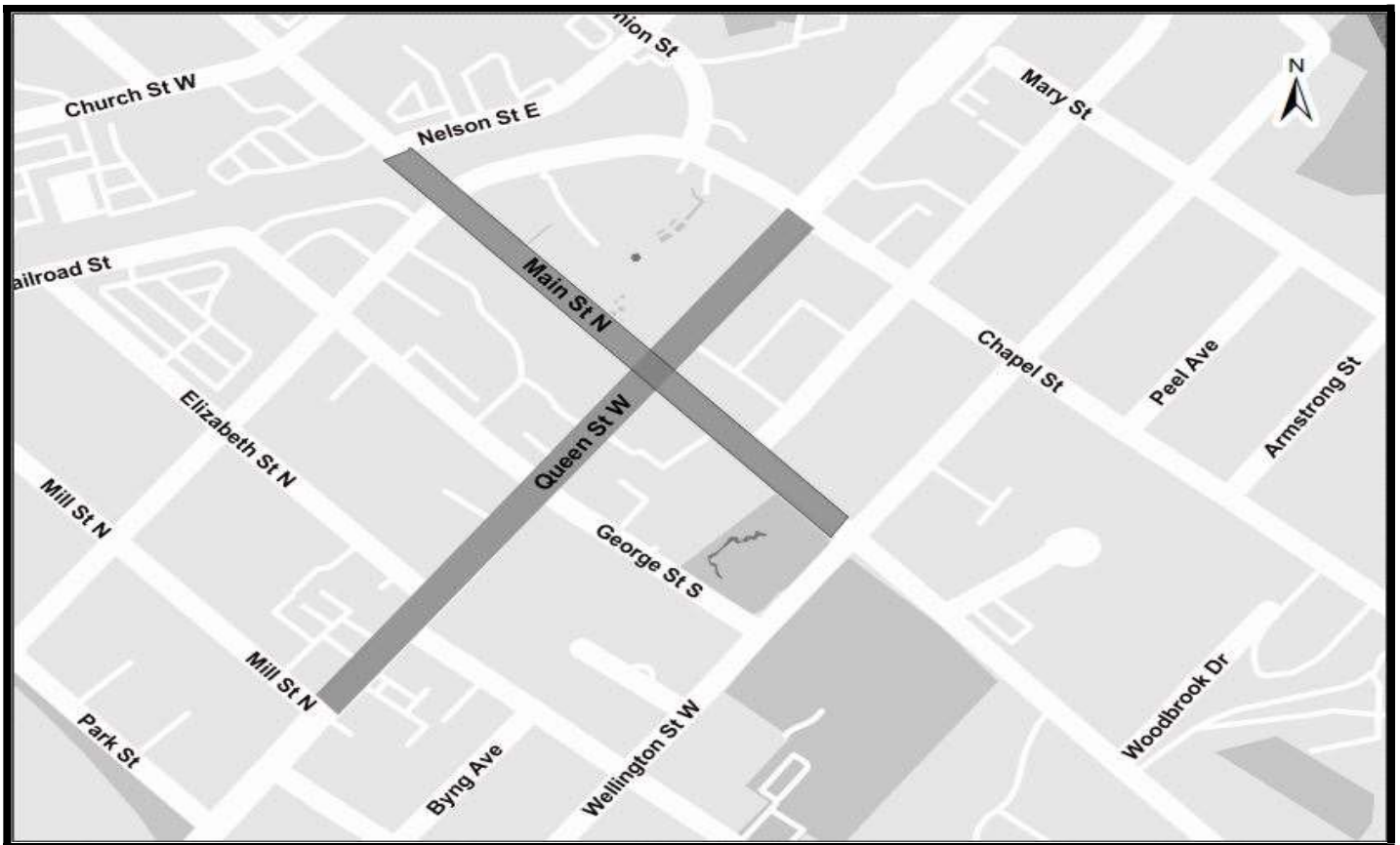
The City of Brampton will be starting the Downtown Brampton Streetscape work along Main Street between Nelson Street and Wellington Street, and Queen Street between Mill Street and Chapel Street. This project is part of the Council-approved direction to Revitalize the Downtown Core.

The work involves widening of existing sidewalks with new granite pavers, narrowing roadways to one lane in each direction and resurfacing the pavement, constructing semi-mountable granite curbs with 1.5m wide bicycle lane, installing new moveable planter, installing new street furniture (i.e., benches) and replacing six traffic signals with new components.

Please note that construction will take place at various times between 2024 and 2027, and not for the entire duration of the contract. Work will be phased and require segmented closures on one side of the street.


Access to local businesses will be available during construction.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Impact Notice before work begins with more information about road closures and traffic management.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Important information for Business Owners. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>If you have any concerns about the removal of private items, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
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WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 am to 7 pm, Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate about what is happening on site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p>Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Field Ambassador <u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Traffic during construction will be reduced to one lane in the active construction zone.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will impact on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated.</p> <p>Free municipal parking is available in downtown Brampton. Visit Brampton.ca/parking for a listing.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
