Looking for a way to get more involved in your neighbourhood? Across Brampton, residents are coming together to build stronger connections, create positive change and make their communities a better place to live.

The **Affiliated Neighbourhood Association program** continues to grow with 64 active Neighbourhood Associations this year – a 68 per cent increase since 2024. The program empowers residents to work together to identify local priorities, strengthen community safety and foster a greater sense of belonging.

This year, more than 110 resident-led projects are planned across Brampton.

Some of the most popular initiatives include:

- Street parties that strengthen neighbourly connections.
- Litter clean-ups that help keep communities clean and welcoming.
- Movie nights that bring residents together and increase their sense of belonging.

CSWO LAUNCHES PUNJABI TRANSLATION OF COMMUNITY SAFETY SURVEY

Since launching in November 2025, more than 2,200 residents have completed the Community Safety & Well-Being Survey, which will help shape Brampton's next Community Safety Action Plan (2028+).

To make the survey more accessible, CSWO recently launched a Punjabi-language version, to help reduce language barriers and encourage broader participation. This initiative reflects CSWO's commitment to making public engagement accessible so more residents can share their experiences and perspectives.

YOU'RE INVITED TO LEARN ABOUT COMMUNITY SAFETY

Join the conversation on community safety at the next **Brampton Community Safety Advisory Committee (BCSAC) meeting on August 20 at Cassie Campbell Community Centre.**

BCSAC meetings bring residents together with City staff and community partners to discuss local safety issues, share information and identify opportunities to build a safer, more connected Brampton. The most recent meeting featured presentations from CSWO, Region of Peel, Peel Regional Police, and the City's Traffic Operations and Parking team, with practical information on road safety, traffic calming measures and e-scooter safety.

If you ride an e-scooter, know the rules:

- Be at least 16 years old.
- Wear a helmet (mandatory for riders under 18).
- Obey traffic laws and ride at a safe speed of 24 km/h or less.
- Stay alert – don't ride while distracted.
- Single rider only – no passengers or cargo.
- Only ride on bike lanes, multi-use paths, or roads that have a speed limit of 50 km/h or less.
