CENTURY GARDENS YOUTH HUB

The former Lawn Bowling Club facility and grounds will be demolished to make way for a new 12,500 square foot youth hub space that will feature youth-oriented design and activities, including games and e-sports, group education and career advice, social services and more. The adjacent lands to the youth hub will provide activity space for youth to play games, grow gardens and gather for special events.

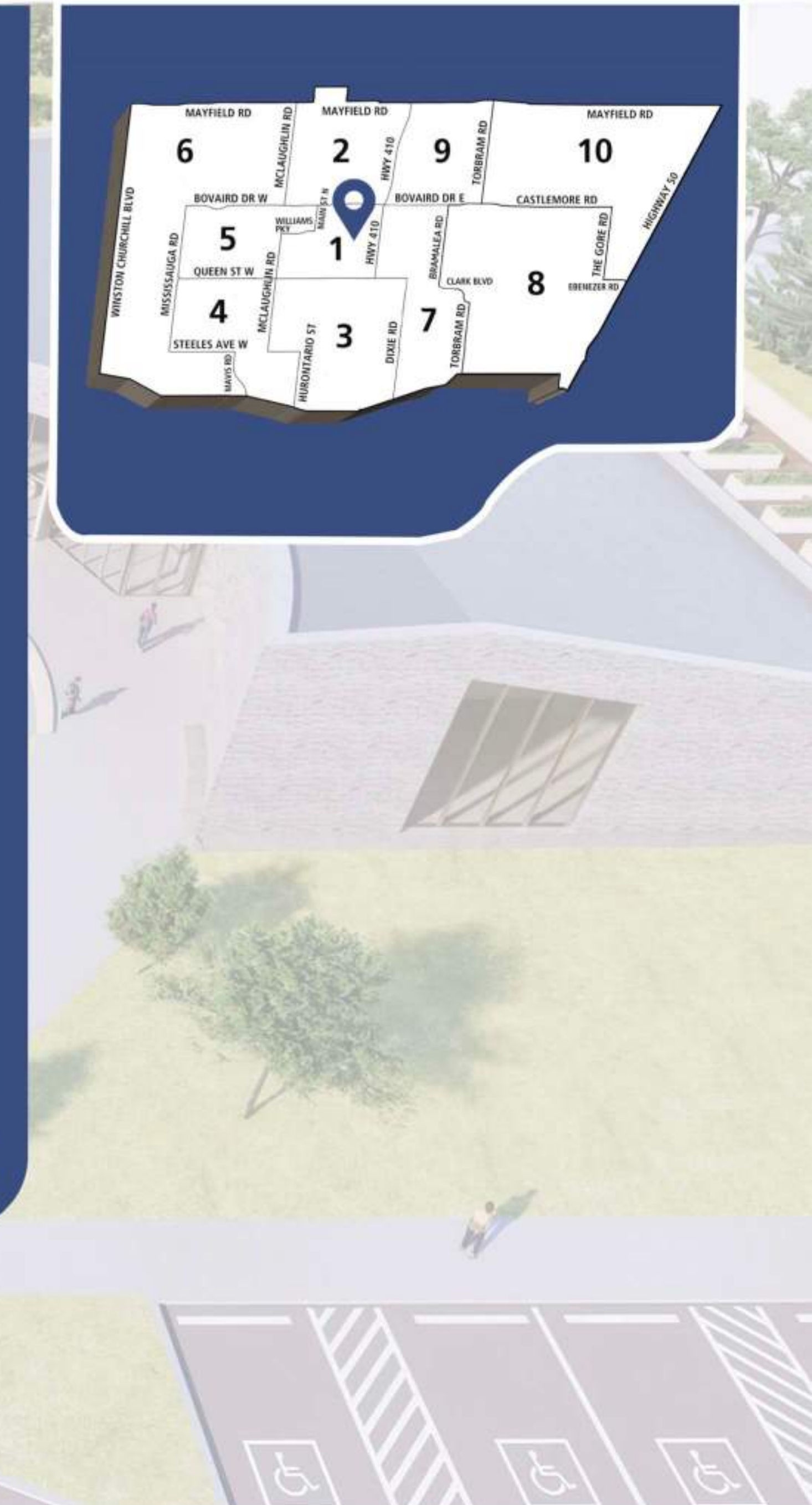

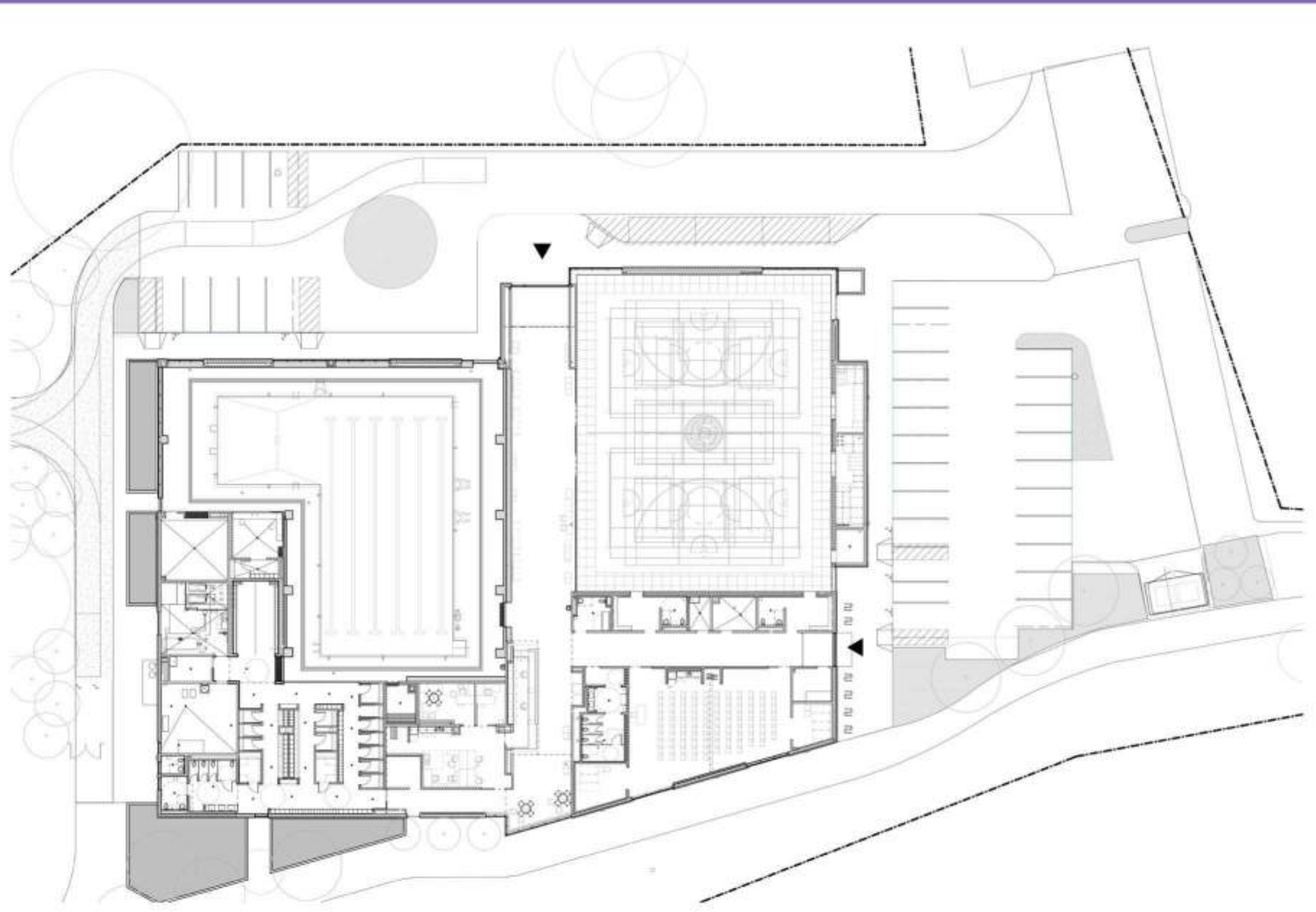

Balmoral Recreation Centre is undergoing a significant renovation which will maintain the existing pool structure but provide new construction that will double the size of the facility to 35,000 square feet. Site improvements will expand the park and establish the Recreation Facility as an important hub in the community.

Proposed Amenities:

- Sprung-wood gymnasium with FIBA basketball court
- Two multi-purpose rooms
- Sauna
- Universal change room
- Splash pad and playground
- Exterior washrooms
- New landscaping and parking spaces

CENTURY GARDENS BOXED SOCCER COURT

Century Gardens will become home to the first artificial turf 'box soccer' court in the City of Brampton. This facility is being established to honour former Canadian Men's National Soccer Team Captain Atiba Hutchinson as a way for youth in the area to learn the game through small-sided games and training sessions in an accessible facility in their community. It is being modelled after the Cruyff soccer courts that can be found throughout Europe.

Proposed Amenities:

- 20m x 38m artificial soccer field
- 10' fencing around the soccer pitch
- Light standards for night games

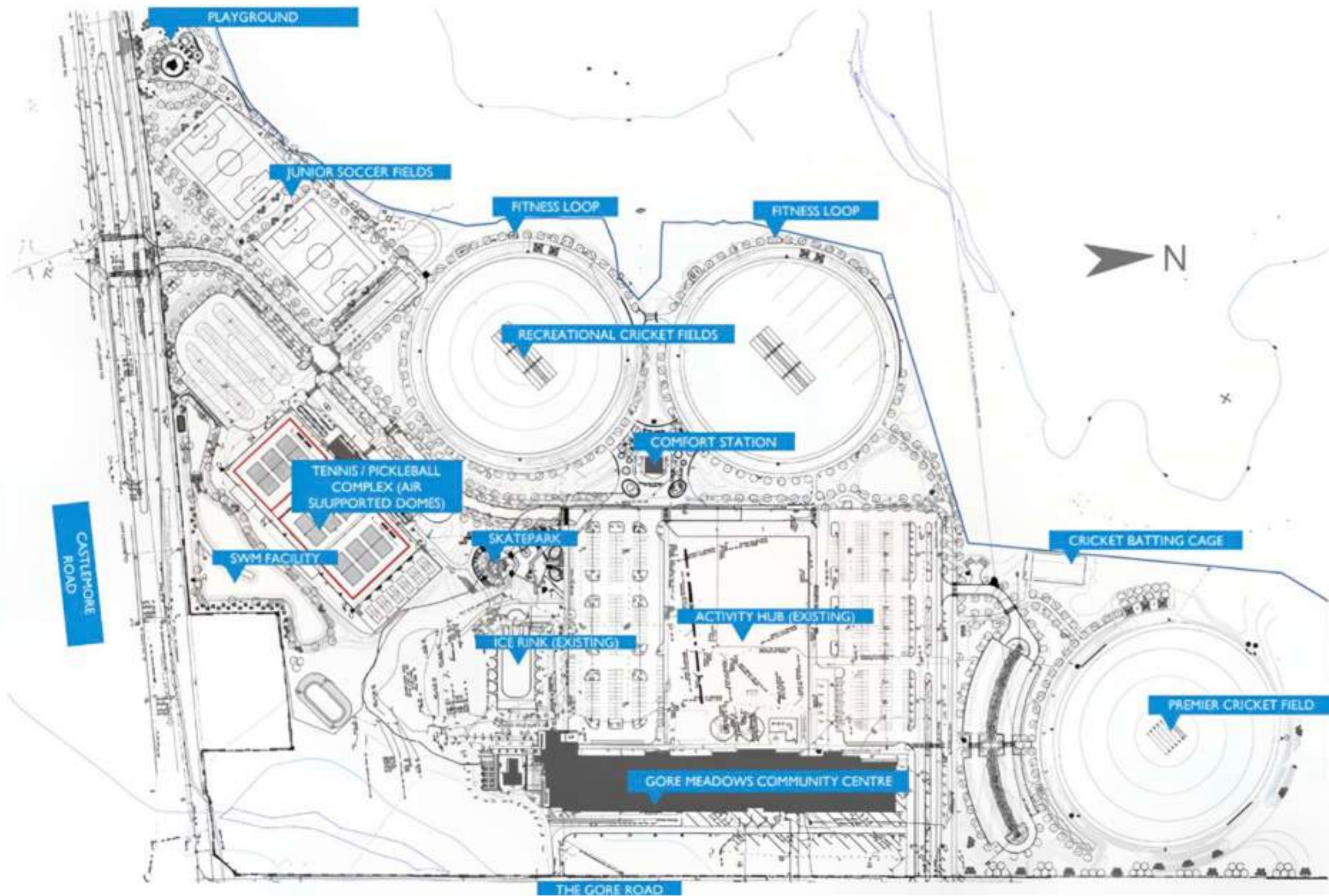

Featuring modern design and construction, it will provide increased access to innovative play structures and recreational amenities for residents of all ages and abilities.

- Tennis and pickleball courts
- Junior soccer fields
- Playground and shade shelter
- Comfort station
- Skateboard park
- Additional parking

- Naturalized environmental areas

Proposed amenities are subject to change.





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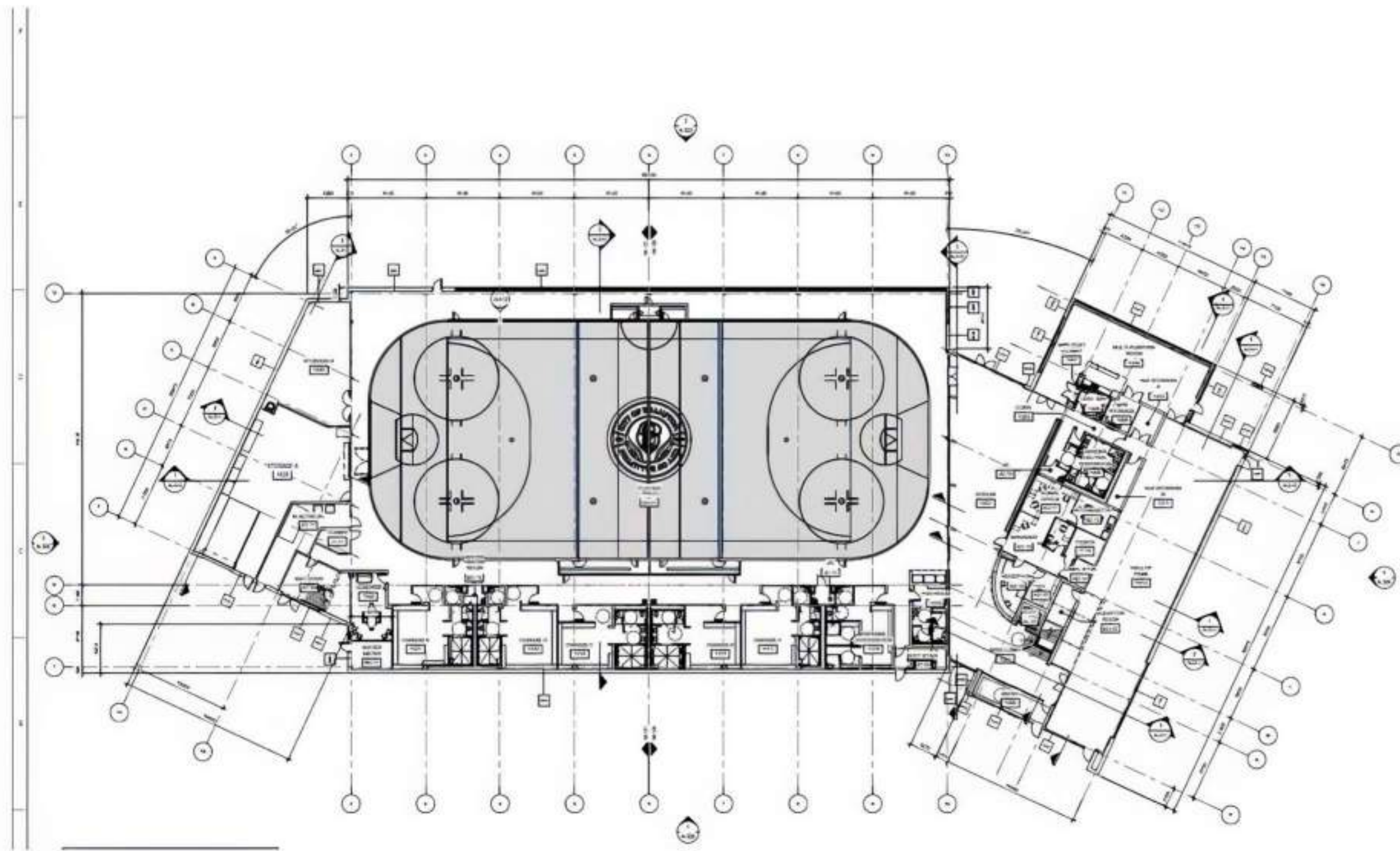

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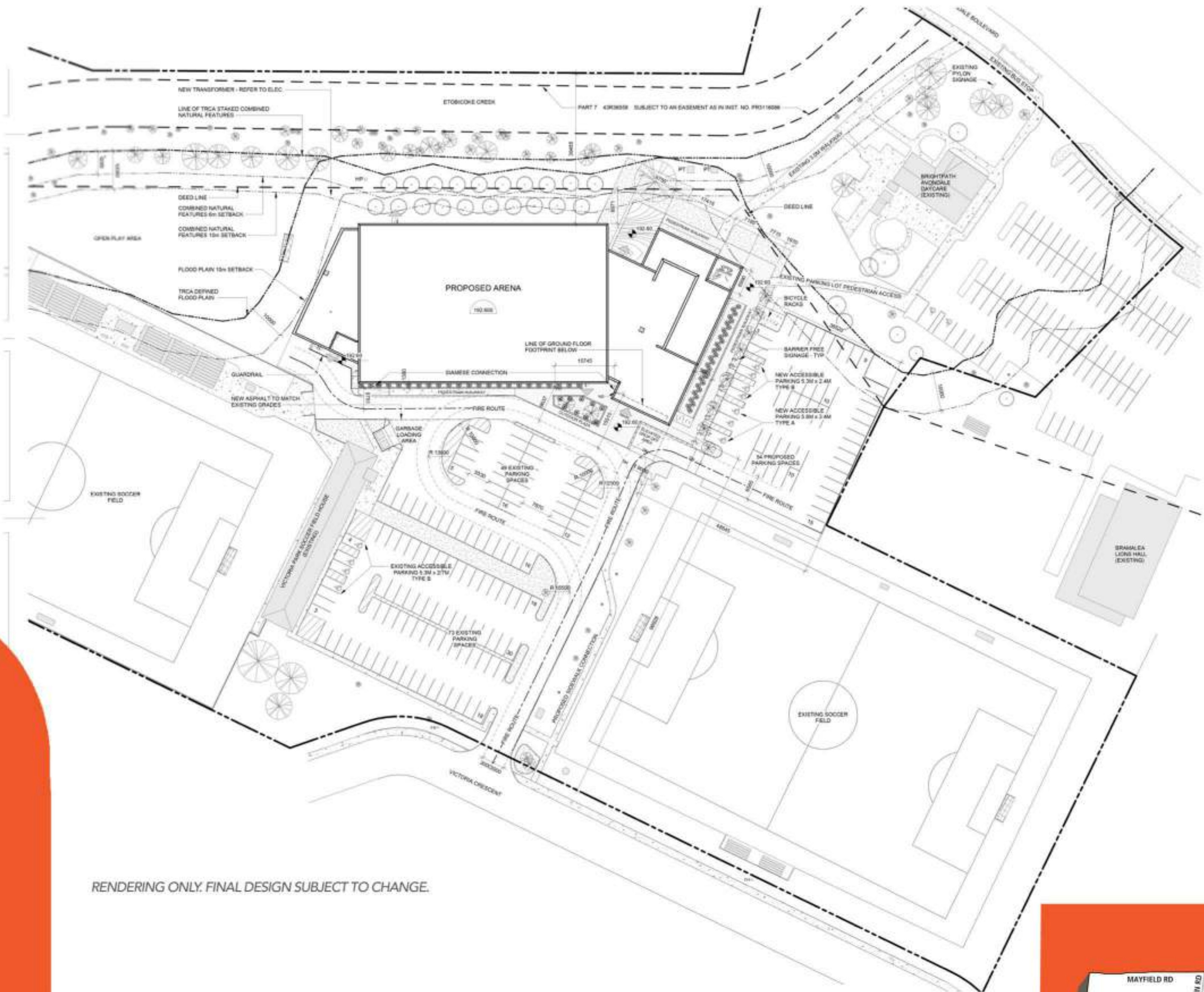

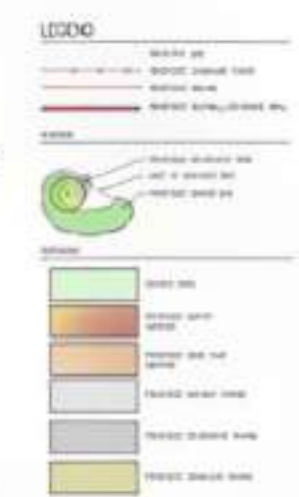
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The original Victoria Park arena was destroyed by fire in 2016. Plans to resurrect the arena as a dry-pad space that could accommodate the needs of multiple sports resulted in a beautiful wood floor arena design with gallery seating for 500 spectators. The opportunity to showcase Brampton's rich sports history presented itself through this project as well, so the Brampton Sports Hall of Fame will make a new home in Victoria Park Arena when it is complete.

Proposed Amenities:

- Full-size dry multi-sport wooden floor
- Gallery seating for 500 people (including accessible spaces)
- Change rooms and office space for teams using space for training
- Multi-purpose room
- Brampton Sports Hall of Fame (4,000 sq. ft. dedicated space)

This park was designed to fulfill the need for a multi-seasonal, multi-generational space for the Sandalwood Heights Community. The transformation of a vacant green space at the busy intersection of Torbram and Sandalwood will provide recreation and respite for all ages in activities from gardening to tennis to parkour and playgrounds that will allow imaginations to soar.

Proposed Amenities:

- Tennis/pickleball courts
- Basketball courts
- Splash pad
- Adventure playground
- Parkour amenities
- Community gardens
- Off-leash dog park
- Shade shelters

Proposed amenities are subject to change.





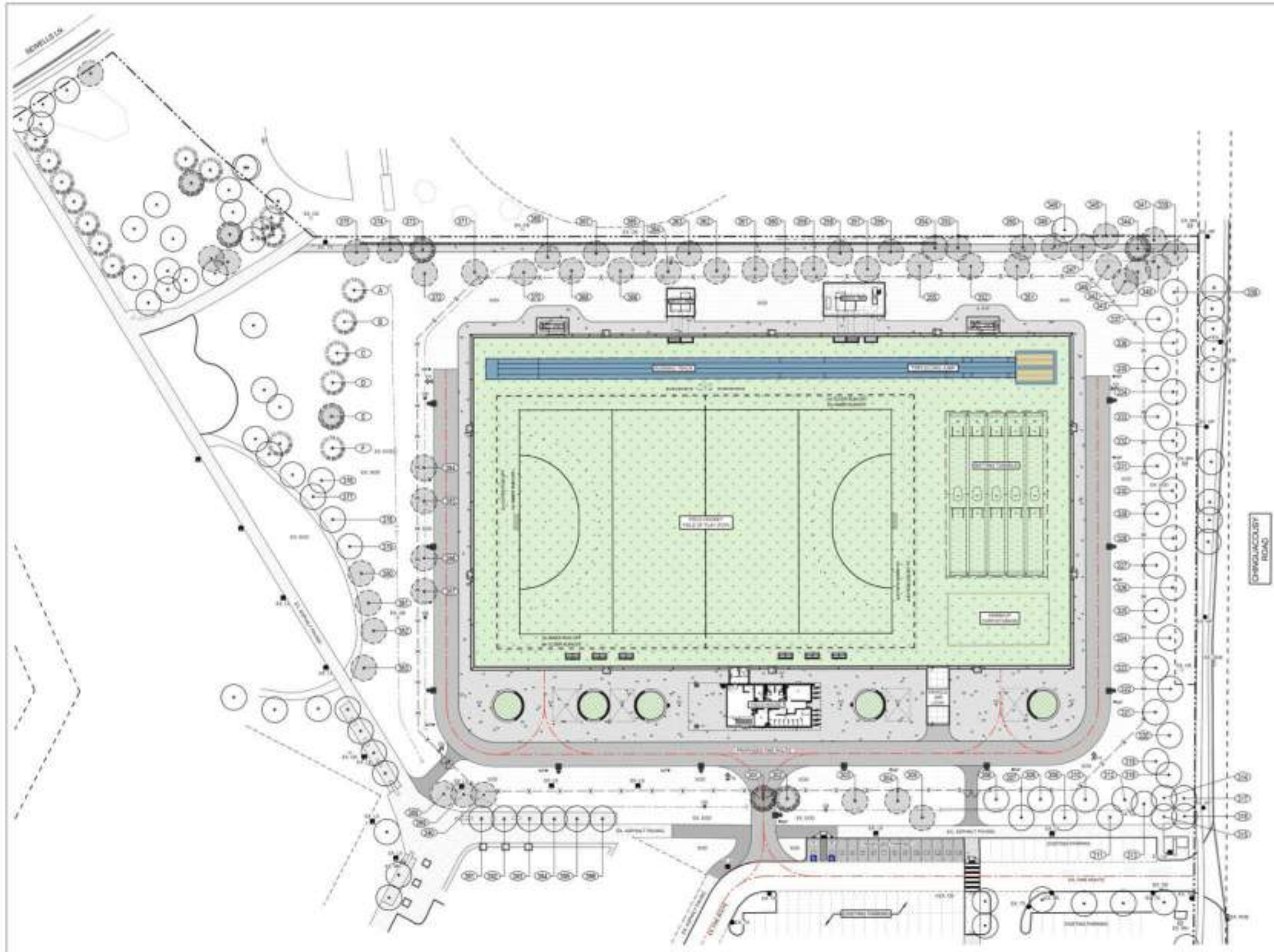

This facility will provide a second competition grade turf field for field hockey play on the main space. Additional training space will be provided for cricket and baseball batting/pitching cages as well as an indoor track with long jump pits. The entire facility will be enclosed with a year-round dome with an attached pavilion to service the needs of the athletes on site.

Proposed Amenities:

- Dry turf field for field hockey
- Batting/hitting tunnels for cricket and baseball training
- Indoor track
- Two sand pits for long jump and triple jump
- Pavilion with change room and washrooms
- Updated site work and landscaping
- New pathways and parking
- Exterior lighting for the dome

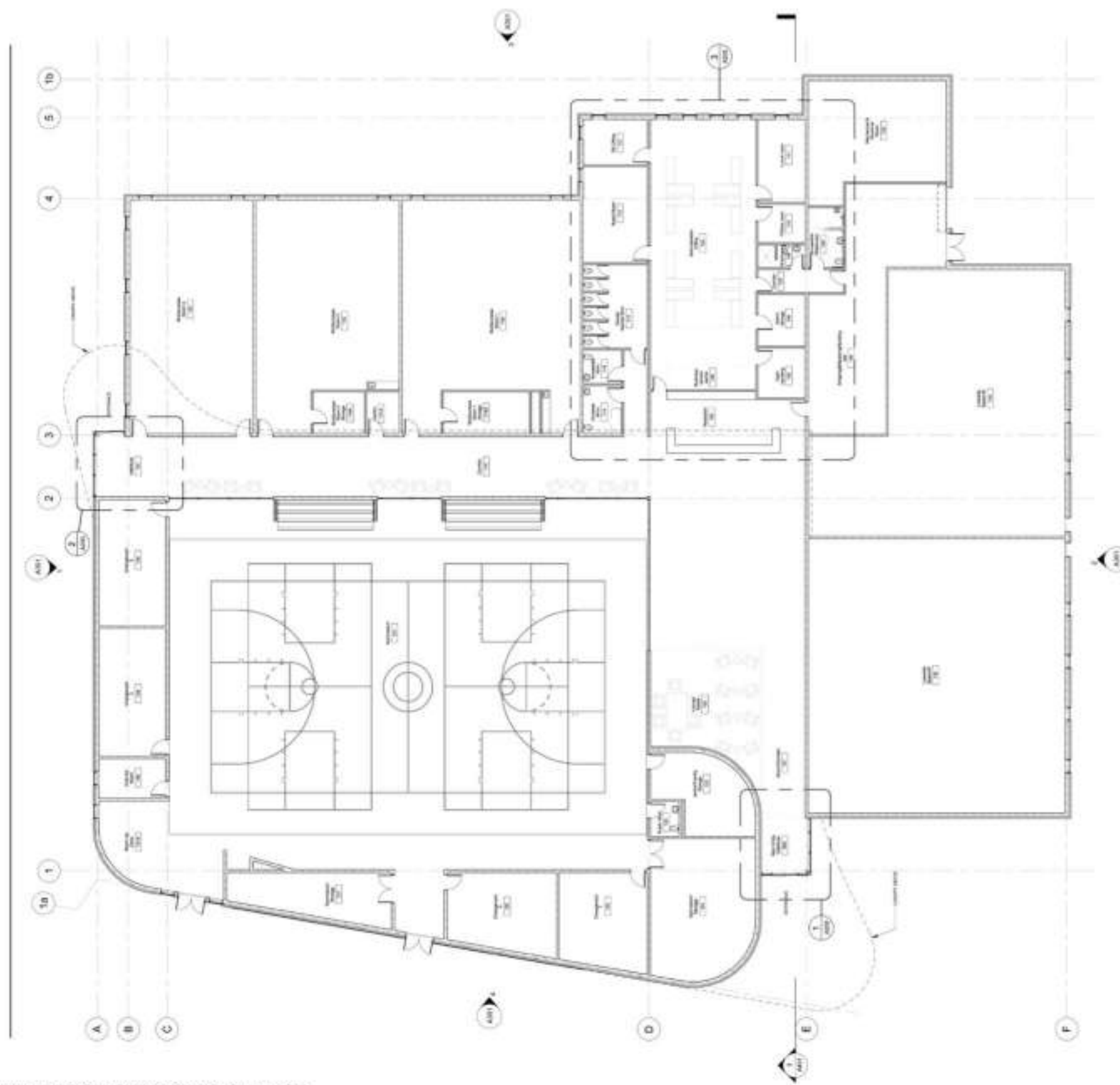

A collaboration between the City of Brampton's Recreation Division and Peel District School Board. The Turner Fenton Cricket Pitch is the City's first joint-use cricket project. With artificial turf wickets and player pavilions, this fully lit pitch will be a great space for the both the students at Turner Fenton Secondary School as well as the public to utilize. Outside of school hours, the City will have priority access and opportunities to rent the pitch to community sports groups.

Proposed Amenities:

- Fully lit artificial turf field and wicket
- Bleachers
- Players pavilions

Construction of a new Howden Recreation Centre is anticipated after the demolition of the existing structure has been completed. The new facility will include a multi-purpose gymnasium with a FIBA-sized court, several multi-purpose rooms, outdoor courts and play areas.

Chris Gibson Recreation Centre is slated for a complete renovation and retrofit of the existing facility. The renovation will include several new amenities as well as upgrades to the existing multi-purpose rooms, auditorium, customer service desk, entrance, and pool.

- Fully accessible NHL sized ice rink

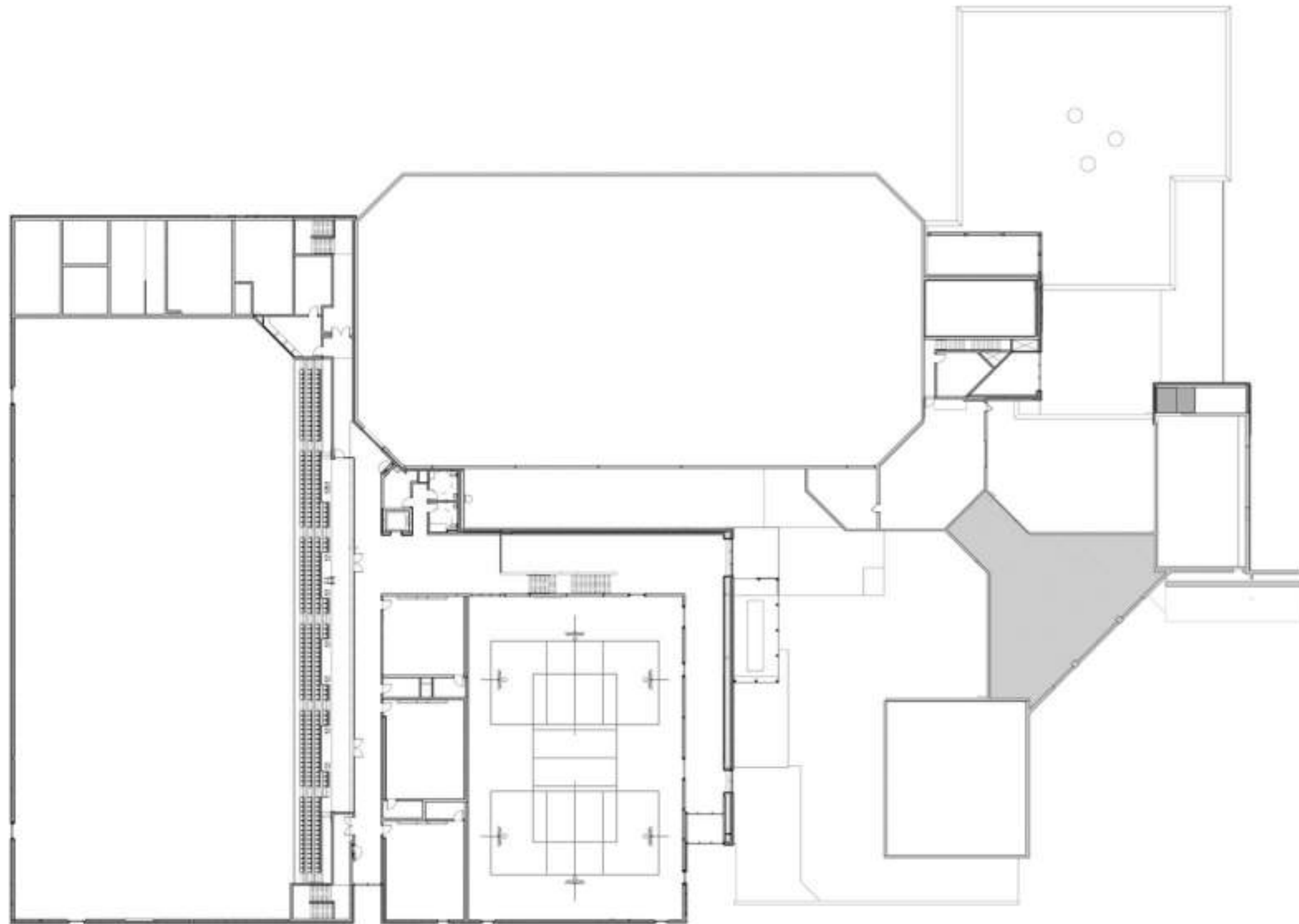

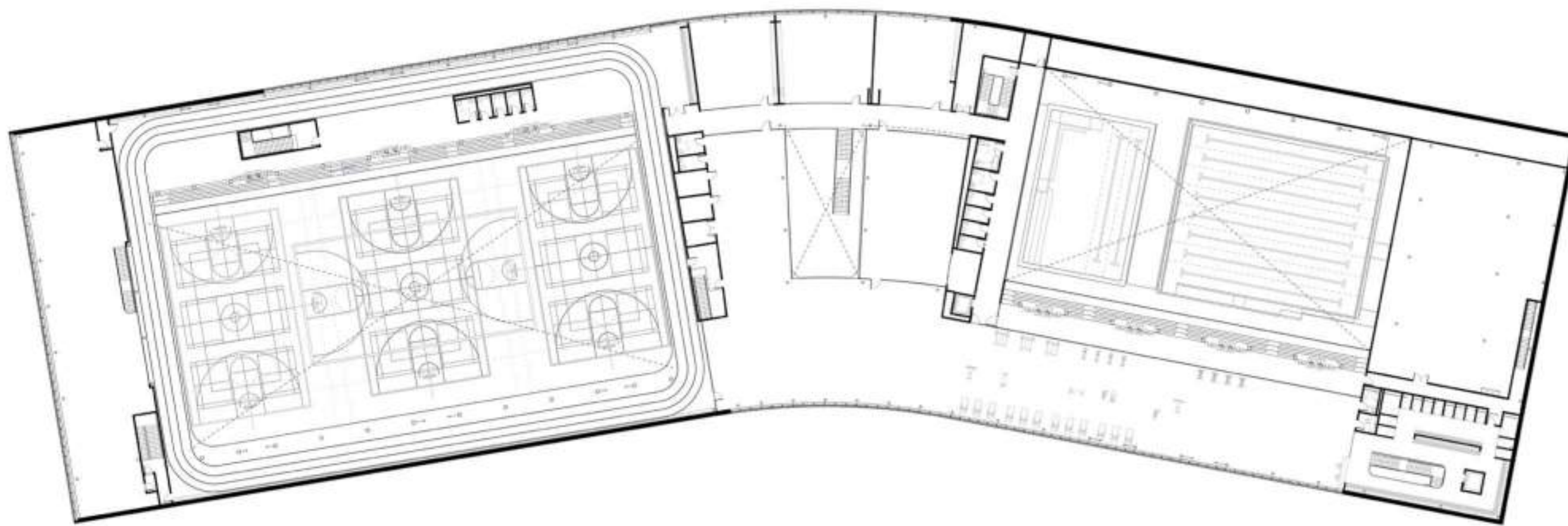

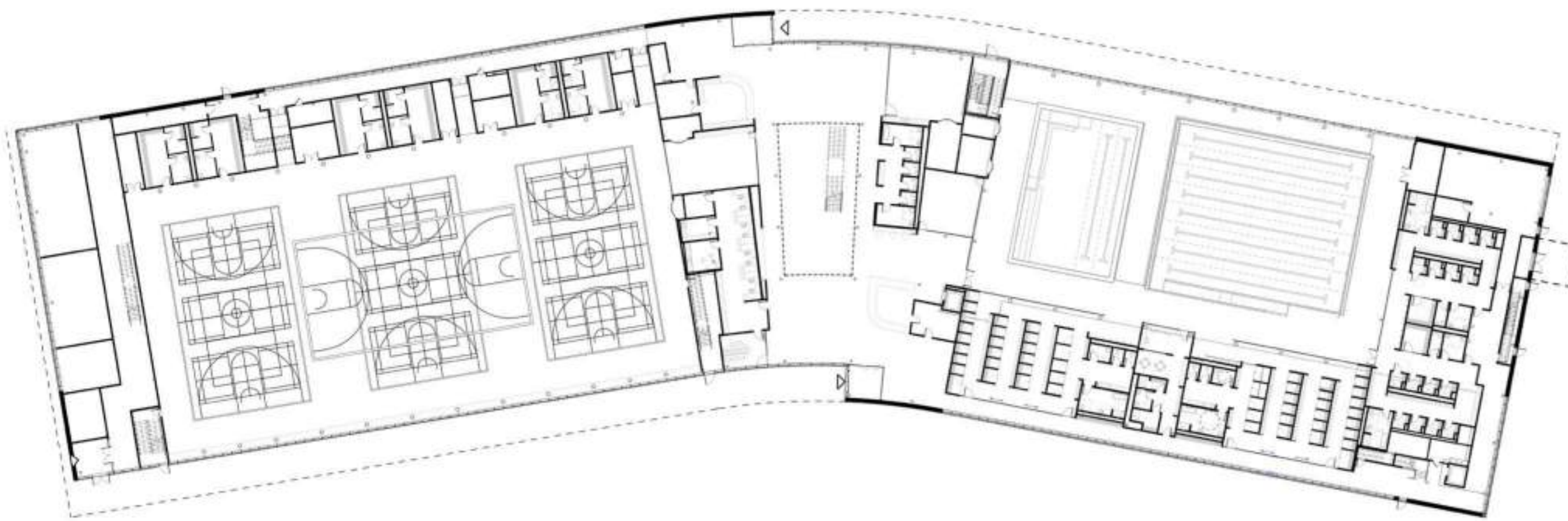

The centre will be situated on a large campus that includes several outdoor amenities and shared spaces that will eventually be populated by future school and housing developments. This facility will be the cornerstone of this community when completed.

- 8-lane lap pool and leisure pool
- Triple gymnasium
- Fitness centre
- Walking track
- Multi-purpose rooms

- Splash pad
- Playground
- Covered ice rink and dry floor area (seasonally)

ACHIEVEMENTS SINCE THE LAST PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN (2017)

New Parkland: Acquired over 100 hectares (250 acres) of recreational parkland with more lands reserved for future parks in designated greenfields, intensification / MTSA and urban growth centres.

Enhanced Park Acquisition Policies: Updated the Brampton plan, adopted a park plan, and parkland acquisition strategies continue to be updated to support population growth and deliver new urban parks to intensification and urban growth centres.

New Community Centres: Expanded Gore Meadows Community Centre & Park, acquired and renovated the Riverstone Community Centre, and planning the Embleton Community Centre & Park.

Save Max Sports Centre: Converted two outdoor fields to artificial turf (one was domed) and an indoor field to a triple gym.

Facility Revitalizations: Renovated Paul Palleschi Recreation Centre, currently rejuvenating the Balmoral Recreation Centre and Chris Gibson Recreation Centre, and are rebuilding the Victoria Park Arena and Howden Recreation Centre.

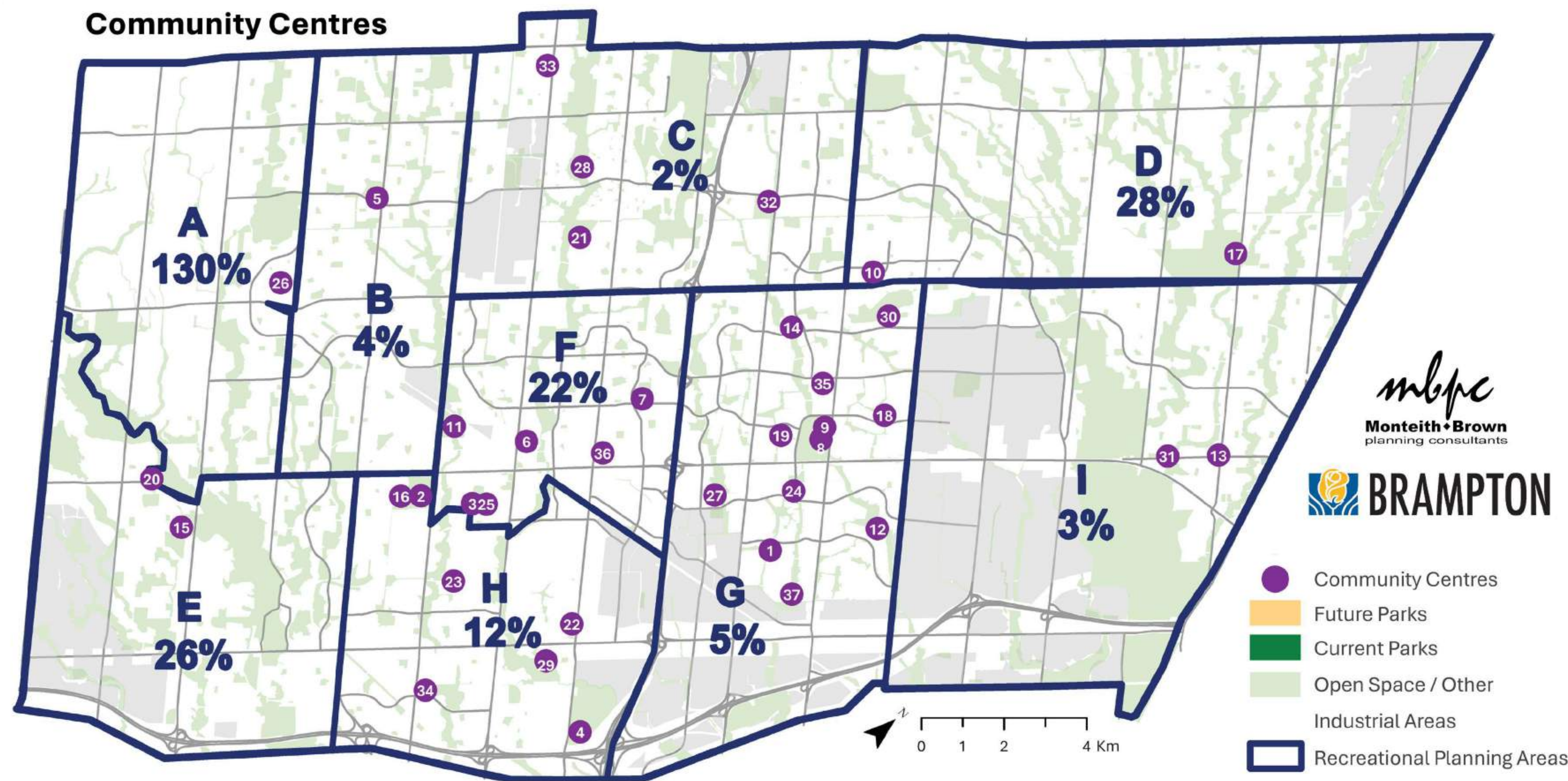
Cricket Grounds: Invested in new and existing grounds including dedicated and lit fields.

Youth Hubs & Outdoor Activity Hubs: Developed at Susan Fennell Sportsplex, Gore Meadows Community Park, Sesquicentennial Park, and a new Youth Hub is planned for Century Gardens Recreation Centre.

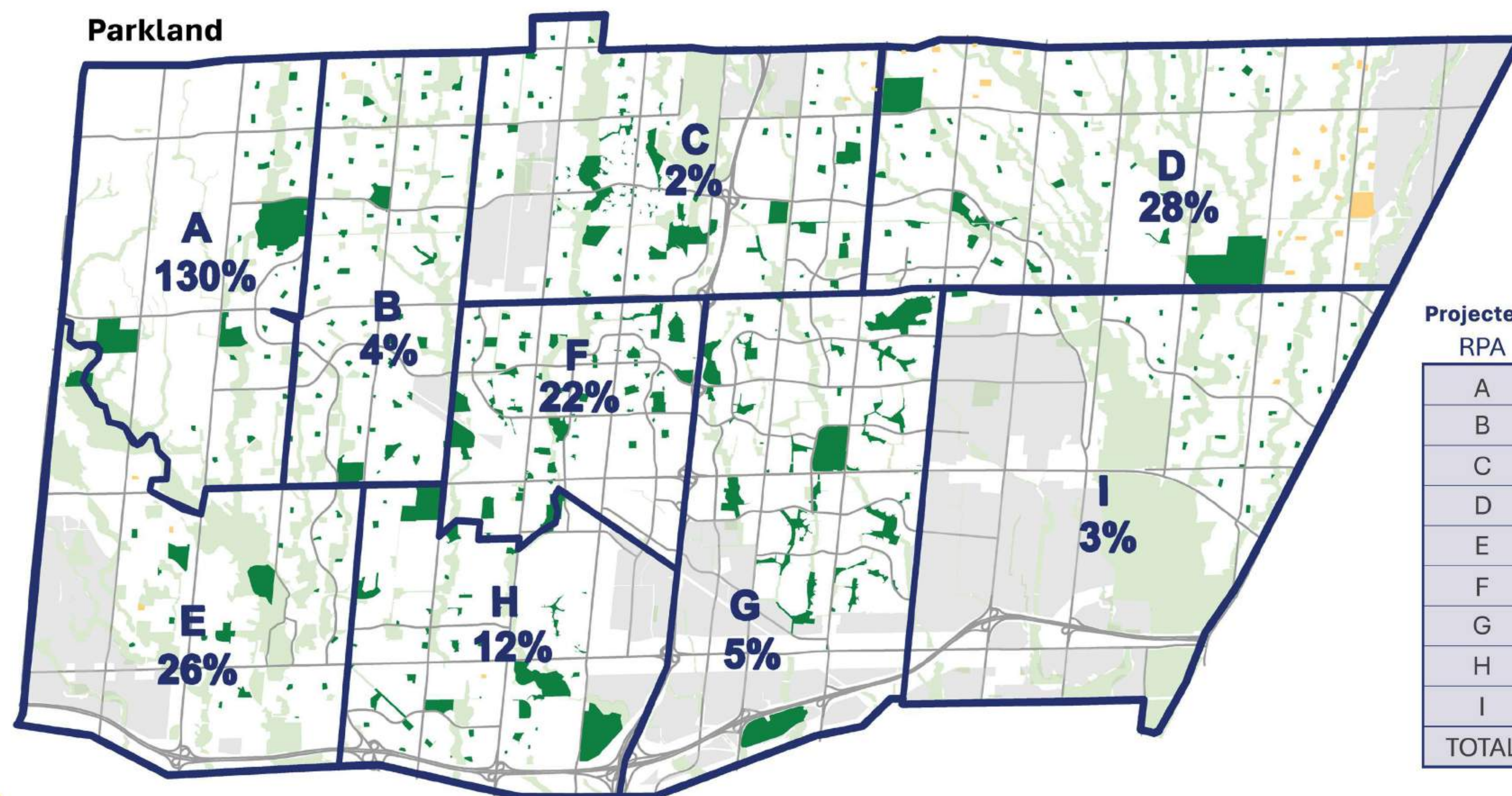
Winterization of Outdoor Amenities: Implemented additional outdoor rinks and support for planned tennis and cricket domes.

Parkland Dedication: The City has updated its Parkland dedication By-law to support the changing and growing need for parkland both in the Greenfields and Intensification/Growth areas.

KEY NEW PROPOSED INITIATIVES

The Draft 5-Year Update to the PRMP organizes recommendations into key themes or goals:

01 Unite a Healthy Community using Parks and Recreation

Expand the Save Max Sports Centre to provide more meeting and program space.

Develop an Older Adult Strategy and Youth Engagement Strategy.

Prioritize parkland acquisition and renewal projects in areas of need.

Engage Indigenous communities and professionals through parks and recreation projects.

Investigate expansion of the City's ActiveAssist program for those experiencing low income.

02 Support Complete Communities and Neighbourhood Revitalization

Revitalize the Jim Archdekin Recreation Centre.

Use future parks and recreation projects to support objectives of Culture Master Plan and Public Art Strategy.

Explore ways to incorporate natural/adventure playgrounds and compact off-leash areas within higher-density areas.

03 Proactively Plan Greenfield Areas

Construct a community centre in the northwest/Heritage Heights that includes an aquatic centre, gymnasium, fitness space, Youth Hub and more.

Initiate a land banking strategy in the northwest and northeast for future community centres.

Include a rectangular field, a major splash pad, tennis and pickleball courts, skateboard park, multi-use sport court, playground, reflection pool/outdoor rink at Gore Castlemore Park (Block 47).

04 Connect Bramptonians to the Outdoors

Target parkland at a rate of 1.6 hectares per 1,000 residents.

Prepare a Parks Renewal Project List to prioritize parks that would benefit from enhancements.

05 Provide Pathways for Sport

Investigate the potential for a 50 metre pool at a future community centre if supported through business and financial planning exercise.

Centralize Brampton's supply of curling sheets at a single facility.

Continue to establish Brampton as the Cricket Capital of Canada by adding two lit cricket grounds, continuing to improve amenities at existing grounds, and exploring more joint-use opportunities with school boards.

Assess the feasibility of a permanent kabaddi venue that explores suitable locations, supporting infrastructure required, and financial implications.

06 Position Parks and Recreation for Success

Continue to engage with School Boards to plan recreation facilities.

Rebalance the geographic distribution of baseball diamonds.

Reduce the number of single pad arenas.

07 Realize the Potential of the PRMP

Prepare an Implementation Strategy that identifies the timing for each PRMP Initiative.

Prepare a funding plan that establishes the capital and operating implications associated with the PRMP initiatives.
